The meeting was called to order by Board President Ross Block.

The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Board President Ross Block.

The 2023-2024 budget hearing was held.

The Consent Agenda included the following items: to approve the agenda, to approve the minutes of the June 12<sup>th</sup> and June 29<sup>th,</sup> 2023, meetings; to approve the financial report; to approve the bills as presented. Eric Wilmarth moved to approve the consent agenda. Motion was seconded by Dawn Rasmussen, motion carried.

CITIZEN'S INPUT: Nicole Nelson and Carissa Zysset addressed the board concerning the status of the Midland school for the upcoming year. Mr. Hermann and the board addressed the concern, they are still looking for a certified teacher, and are also looking at other options including transporting children to Kadoka. Mr. Hermann has had meetings with the parents and sent letters to keep them updated. He will have another public meeting in the near future. The board assured them that they would do what they could to keep the school open.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT: Mr. Hermann invited the board to the MS/HS open house which will be held on Wednesday night at the new school where a snack will be served and building tours given.
