#### PATHWAYS LEAD TO SUCCESS

We know that preparing our students for successful futures means more than just innovative teaching that is happening every day in our classrooms. It also means meaningful opportunities for different types of learning, including real-world experiences in real businesses, and support for our students as they look beyond high school and toward the future. For most cases, these work experiences are embedded into our Career Pathways program. Pathways focus on a large variety of specific career areas and provide directed coursework and opportunities for students to earn career credentials and college credits before they leave our school. Our students can graduate with certifications in a variety of trades including EMT and firefighting, experience teaching in school classrooms and experience in automotive tech, food and nutrition, entrepreneurship and agriculture. Students leave the DCSS with direction and promise. Dodge County High School provides the following Pathways:

### DODGE COUNTY PRIMARY/ SOUTH DODGE ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

Mrs. Mullis and Ms. Walker's third grade class won Discover Dairy Moo Cow Dance Challenge two years in a row! Discover Dairy is an engaging, interactive, cross-curricular educational series. Through Discover Dairy Mrs. Mullis' class adopted Magic from farmer Katelin at Big Creek Farm.

Mrs. Kim Peterson's second grade class learns with hands-on activities such as incubating and hatching eggs in their classroom! Students were overly excited to learn about the life cycle of chicks and learn what it's like to take care of something from the beginning of its life.

Fourth and fifth graders were able to attend the Mobile Ag Classroom of the Georgia Ag Experience provided by the Georgia Foundation for Agriculture. They visited with the GA Farm Bureau mascot "Lucky" as part of this unique STEMbased educational program that invites students across Georgia to explore the vast opportunities in agriculture.

First grade students experienced a different kind of test. They taste-tested oroblancos! Oroblancos are a hybrid citrus fruit that tastes like sweet grapefruit. Students used their senses to rate roblancos' taste, texture and smell. This experience was hosted by the Dodge County School Nutrition Program as part of the Fresh Fruit and Vegetable Grant.

Dodge County students placed in the top four out of 11 other different school districts in the Heart of Georgia writing contests! Way to go!!! Jonteria Walker from second grade and Kendall Hobbs from first grade both earned second place in the recent writing contest.

South Dodge students donated 2,100 canned food items for the "Kids 4 Cans" campaign. These canned food items were sent to our local food bank and will be used to meet the needs of the families in Dodge County.

South Dodge Elementary school was awarded a \$10,000 check in person! The Georgia Foundation for Public Education awarded Shannon Taylor as a Rural Education grant winner! She plans to utilize the money for STEM activities at SDES. We look forward to seeing the academic gains that our students obtain with this program implemented!

Students in Mrs. Williams' fifth grade science class enjoyed using a STEM kit to discover differences in chemical and physical changes with invisible ink. They also had a blast exploring how circuits operate to create electricity! Funds from the Rural Education Grant awarded to Shannon Taylor were used to purchase this activity.

# ELEMENTARY CONSOLIDATION BEGINS WITH THIS SCHOOL YEAR!

We are excited about our upcoming consolidation! Beginning with the 2023-24 school year, SDES, Dodge Pre-K and NDES will be consolidated in the following format: Dodge County Primary School, Pre-K - 2nd grades at the South Dodge Elementary facility; and Dodge County Elementary School: 3rd - 5th grades at the North Dodge Elementary facility. The DCSS has solicited input from our DCSS staff and from our community via surveys and other means prior to the Board of Education unanimously voting to move forward with consolidation plans. To serve our students and to meet their needs consistently, we see advantages to having all teachers and students of one grade level in one building. Some advantages of consolidation are:

- 1. Uniformity in having the same grade levels at the same school.
- 2. Emphasized teaching of phonics and reading in kindergarten through second grade so that students are reading on grade level by Grade 3.
- 3. Increased fidelity with use of purchased programs across the system.
- 4. Increased teacher collaboration for grade levels at the same school location.
- 5. Increased academic achievement.
- 6. Increased resource sharing.
- 7. Increased consistency with rules and procedures.
- 8. Decreased competition among elementary schools.
- 9. Additional resources for Dodge Pre-K (access to a gym, enhanced safety, etc.).
- 10. Improved grade level focus and parent communication.
- 11. Improved use of data for specific grades to guide effective and focused instruction.
- 12. Increased ease of transition for students from elementary school to middle school since students will already know one another.
- 13. Mainstreamed scheduling since seat time is different for Grades K through 2 than for Grades 3 through 5.
- 14. Synchronized testing so that testing for Grades 3 through 5 will not affect daily routines for K through 2.

School and district staff are diligently working to prepare the schools for our students this fall. The Dodge County School System is thankful for the students, staff, parents, community and Board of Education that work together each day to do great things for our students.
