	Hold is called when the hallways need to be kept clear due to a situation. Students and staff are instructed to clear the halls and remain in a classroom until the situation is resolved. 	LockDOWN Danger inside or very near building. 1	Shelter Students and staff take safe shelter. Examples: • Tornado, earthquake or other natural events	DISTRICT ACTION: Active with district and emergency responders PARENT ACTION: Remain home unless told otherwise	How will you know?
Ťi	Reunification As a result of any of the above scenarios, students may need to be reunified with parents through a controlled release at the school or a reunification at an identified location.
