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## Early Childhood Learning

Spark. Nurture. Explore. — One Student at a Time

At UNISUS, we believe that igniting a love for learning and a passion to make a positive impact starts at the beginning of a child's education.

The structured play based approach of our Early Years Program encourages natural wonder and curiosity in each child and introduces the youngest members of our UNISUS community to a lifelong journey of learning.

### In the Early Childhood Learning Centre we:

- Encourage each child to express their creativity in a playbased learning environment through the arts, music, and physical activity
- Support the development of language skills, motor skills, social skills, and academic skills through an Inquiry-based approach to learning
- Prepare students for the transition to Kindergarten through letter recognition and the formative stages of language and mathematics, which is introduced when students demonstrate understanding or a readiness to learn more
- Discover the world outside through our outdoor-based preschool program (30% -50% of the day is spent outside). Nature is infused into all aspects of the ECL program as the IB pedagogy emphasizes inquiry-based learning through play and hands-on discovery
- Nurture students' social-emotional development by learning to take turns, become independent, follow routines, interact with peers, engage in meaningful relationships with others, and develop a positive selfimage

## Primary Years Programme (PYP)

## Ignite. Inquire. Engage. — One Student at a Time

We believe early exposure to rich academic and cultural experiences ignite our students to become critical thinkers, global-minded citizens, and positive change-makers in the world.

The UNISUS PYP Junior School programme features an international curriculum framework that anchors our commitment to the development of each child as a "whole" person, introducing life skills that extend to expose students to discover new passions and areas of interest.

The PYP programme integrates subjects that cross traditional subject boundaries. This approach teaches content but extends to include significant concepts to deepen understanding, think critically, and encourage students to find meaning in their learning.





### In the PYP Junior Years Programme we:

- Encourage Inquiry-based approaches to honor and extend student curiosity
- Develop emotional and support strategies
- Support physical wellness and development
- Build critical thinking skills
- Take action to make a difference locally, nationally, and globally
- Gain international perspectives, appreciation and understanding through multicultural studies

- Reflect on real-world experiences
- Integrate technology to deepen learning
- Study global languages
- Inspire learning beyond the classroom through C.A.S.E. (creative, activity, service leadership, and enrichment) after school activities
- Commit to low teacher to student ratios; less than 22 students per class.

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### In the Middle school we:

- Challenge our students intellectually to best prepare them for the IB Diploma Programme.
- Develop creative, critical, and reflective thinking skills encouraging students to make connections with their studies and the real world.
- Nurture the development of effective communication, collaboration, and problem solving, qualities that are essential for life in the 21st century.
- Accelerate English with additional language acquisition support
- Offer global language support and acquisition programs

- Offer rigorous learning in all subjects, inviting students to tackle relevant issues and apply their ideas in local, national and global contexts.
- Develop skills and attitudes for responsible action
- Examine the interconnectedness of subject disciplines
- Provide community building opportunities, including a House System
- Challenge our students with "leading-edge" technology to deepen their learning experience

## University Counselling

The UNISUS approach to the university application process is holistic and uses the university search as a tool for further self-exploration.

We support and empower students to discover what they need to be successful and navigate the university application process. They learn how to find solutions to what might seem like barriers and access scholarships and financial aid. Students know how to tell their story because we work together to help them find and use their voices.



### **University Counselling provides:**

- Summer program application support
- Thorough explanation of application processes for domestic and international students
- Development of college/university application list based on student's goals
- Guidance for college/university visit planning and assistance with the application process including:
- » Preparation for college/university admission interviews
- » College/university application organization and timeline creation
- » Discussion of Scholarship and Financial Aid opportunities
- » Personal statements and supplemental essays
- » Scholarship essays
- » Standardized Testing Planning
- » Presentation of student's school engagement and participation in extracurricular activities, athletics, internships, research, and employment
- » Preparation of supplemental materials
- » Submission of Common Application, UCAS, and application formats

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
