- Share strategies parents can use at home
- Explain how teachers and parents will communicate about student progress
- Describe opportunities for parents to volunteer, observe, and participate in the classroom.

DISTRICT GOALS

Reading: Students will perform at or above the state, grade-level proficiency in English/Language Arts.

Math: Students will perform at or above the state, grade-level proficiency in mathematics.

In the First Grade Classroom

The teacher will work with students and their families to achieve the goal of student success in the areas of reading, math, and writing. Teachers will support student learning through:

- **Reading:** Providing reading materials that meet the needs of each individual student
- **Math:** Providing a weekly update on what is being taught in math
- **Writing:** Providing writing guidelines that go hand-in-hand with the lessons taught in the classroom
- **Review:** Math facts and sight words

At Home

Support at home is key to each student reaching their goals in reading, math, and writing. Listed below are a few ideas parents and teachers developed together to help children at home.

Reading: READ with my child EACH night.
