Enrollment & Student Body

Central Catholic enrolls males and females in grades 9 through 12. Our current enrollment of about 1200 young men and women reflects a diversified student body representing various cultural and socioeconomic backgrounds. Students live in over 60 communities in Massachusetts and New Hampshire.

Academic Program

The college preparatory curriculum offers courses on four levels:

Advanced Placement	(Level AP)
Honors	(Level 1)
Enriched College Preparatory	(Level 2)
Standard College Preparatory	(Level 3)

Full year course grades earn 1.0 credits and semester courses earn 0.5 credits towards CCHS graduation.

A minimum of seven credits are required for grades 9 and 10 while a minimum of six credits are required for grades 11 and 12. Students in grades 11 and 12 can enroll in a maximum of seven full year courses.

Notations for 2023-2024 Academic Courses

Religion: Religion is a required course for all year levels. All freshman, sophomore and junior students enroll in the same Religion course. Senior students enroll in a first semester elective and enroll in Christian Lifestyles for the second semester. On the CCHS transcript the Religion courses are noted as Religion I, Religion II, Religion III, and Religion IV.

Health & Physical Education: These courses are not incorporated into the students GPA. The following courses are options in Health & Physical Education: Health I, Health II, Physical Education, Strength & Fitness for Life, Intro to Sports Medicine.

AP Capstone Diploma (Cap): AP Capstone Diploma is awarded to students who complete both AP Seminar & AP Research and score a 3 or higher on the corresponding AP exam. Additionally, these students must score a 3 or higher on four additional AP exams of their choosing.

Dual Enrollment (DE): In partnership with Syracuse University and Southern New Hampshire University, students may earn college credits and a transcript from SU and SNHU indicating completion of the course.
