Gainesville High School is a comprehensive four-year high school located in Gainesville, Georgia, a community of 200,000 residents located 50 miles northeast of Atlanta. The school opened in 1892 and graduated its first senior class in 1894. GHS is part of an independent school district within Hall County with over 2350+ students enrolled in grades 9-12. It is deeply rooted in tradition and has flourished in its reputation as the flagship school of Gainesville and the surrounding Hall County area. The GHS academic program is organized on a yearlong schedule where students are able to earn 7 credits over the course of 2 semesters. Known for excellence in academics, athletics, and fine arts, Gainesville High School continues to build upon its legacy through rigorous AP, Dual Enrollment, and Work Based Learning courses along with 19 CTAE pathway programs. With more than 26 countries represented and 30 languages spoken, 22% of our student population is considered to be Multilingual Learners. Gainesville High School counts its diversity as one of its most notable strengths.
