**DEFINITION:** Under general supervision, performs skilled and semi-skilled work in the maintenance of gardens and grounds.

**DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:** (Any one position may not include all duties listed; the listed examples do not include all duties and responsibilities which may be found in positions within this classification.)

- Performs necessary skilled or semi-skilled grounds maintenance work using applicable power tools and equipment in a variety of duties such as the new installation or repairing of concrete or asphalt paving.
- 2. Mixes, pours forms, and finishes concrete.
- 3. Installs and repairs fences, gates, retaining walls, play boxes, and sandboxes.
- 4. May repair leaks and assists in the installation of sprinkler lines.
- 5. Hauls soil, sand, cement mix, road rock, and other materials for grounds maintenance work.
- 6. Drives trucks, tractors, and other automotive maintenance equipment.
- 7. Maintains, repairs, and replaces all storm drains in the district.
- 8. Maintains decomposed granite athletic tracks at school sites and on district property.
- 9. Initiates, modifies, and closes work orders in automated system.
- 10. Assists other shops with excavating, removing debris, and other duties as needed.
- 11. May prepare soil for planting.
- 12. Performs related work as required.
