POSITION TITLE: Athletic Fields Technician

DEFINITION: Under general supervision, maintains natural grass and artificial playing surfaces of district athletic fields and associated landscaped areas in accordance with district and California Interscholastic Federation (CIF) specifications and guidelines; performs general maintenance and repairs to irrigation systems; may assist Irrigation Technicians as assigned.

DIRECTLY RESPONSIBLE TO: Supervisor, Grounds Operation and Maintenance

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILTIES: (Any one position may not include all of the duties listed; the listed examples do not include all duties and responsibilities that may be found in positions within this classification.):

- 1. Grooms, sweeps and cleans artificial turf and track surfaces per manufacturers' recommendations and replaces or adds infill materials to maintain safe playing conditions as needed.
- 2. Operates assigned equipment to maintain athletic fields per CIF and district specifications.
- 3. Aerates athletic fields to relieve compaction and performs monthly compaction checks in accordance with applicable warranty specifications.
- 4. Mixes herbicides and/or pesticides, per label instructions or as directed, and applies the chemicals in accordance with district integrated pest management plans and applicable state agency guidelines.
- 5. Prepares athletic fields for practices and competitions by marking and lining grass areas with a variety of marking materials and equipment to delineate area of play in accordance with applicable CIF rules, as assigned.
- 6. Prepares and cultivates soils for proper drainage and support of new plantings, grading, fertilizer, seed application, weeding, pruning, and other associated activities for athletic fields and associated landscaped areas.
- 7. Irrigates athletic fields and performs general repair/maintenance to irrigation systems as assigned (i.e. repair/maintenance of broken lines, valves, and sprinkler heads, etc.) and notifies irrigation shop for major repairs.
- 8. May provide recommendations of irrigation schedules for athletic fields, as assigned.
- 9. Operates grounds maintenance equipment such as lawn mower, edger, sweeper, blower, string trimmer, rototiller, chain saw, power hedge trimmer, sprayers, and basic gardening hand tools.
- 10. Routinely inspects, services, adjusts, and makes minor repairs to assigned equipment.
- 11. Initiates, modifies, and closes work orders in automated system.
- 12. Uses power or hand saws, power or pole pruners, and similar tools, to trim and remove dead, diseased, damaged, or excess limbs and branches on trees.
- 13. Prunes shrubs and trees, working up to a maximum height of 15 feet, and hauls cuttings.
- 14. Completes required paperwork in compliance with CIF requirements.
- 15. Loads, unloads, and drives district owned trucks and trailers.
- 16. May assist with setting up equipment and facilities for sporting and special events.
- 17. Removes debris from storm drains.
- 18. Blows or sweeps sidewalks.

- 19. Mixes and applies fertilizers.
- 20. Picks up paper and debris on grounds.
- 21. May attend additional trainings related to the preparation and maintenance of athletic fields.
- 22. Performs related work as required.

QUALIFICATIONS:

Education and Experience:

One year of paid gardening experience; formal training in gardening, landscaping, or horticulture may be substituted for up to six months of experience; prior experience maintaining athletic fields is preferred.

Licenses and Certifications:

- Valid California Class C driver's license issued by the California Department of Motor Vehicles within 30 days of hire or before driving any vehicle requiring this license
- Valid Qualified Applicator Certificate issued by the California Department of Pesticide Regulation within 6 months of hire

Knowledge, Skills, and Abilities:

- Knowledge of standard practices, methods, materials, tools, gas-powered equipment, hazards, and safety precautions used in maintaining landscaped areas
- Knowledge of standard practices used in pruning and caring for plants, flowers, shrubs, trees, and lawns
- Knowledge of sports programs and maintenance of athletic fields for schools
- Knowledge of fertilizer and herbicide use and application techniques
- Knowledge of common plants used in school areas
- Knowledge of basic concepts of plant health
- Knowledge of interpersonal skills using tact, patience, and courtesy
- Knowledge and skill in use of computers and assorted software programs
- Ability to operate hand and power tools and other equipment associated with gardening
- Ability to read and understand labels, work orders, and similar items
- Ability to establish and maintain effective relationships with those contacted in the course of work
- Ability to understand and follow verbal and written instructions
- Ability to communicate effectively both verbally and in writing with administrators, staff, students, and the community
- Ability to maintain consistent, punctual and regular attendance

- Outdoor work environment
