We are excited to have access to several acres of outdoor space at our new location! At the Center for Learning, we are committed to creating an environment for the healthy development of our youngest learners. Therefore, our Early Learning classes will be utilizing our outdoor spaces on a regular basis with many opportunities for nature play and exploration. Please come prepared to play, explore, learn, and enjoy in the great outdoors!



Early Childhood Family Education (ECFE) provides programming and service to families of young children. Parents and caregivers are critical to a young child's development and provide a foundation for young learners' success. Early Childhood Family Education works to strengthen families and encourages parents to provide the best possible environment for the healthy development of their children through facilitation of parent-child activities by a licensed early childhood teacher, and parent discussion facilitated by a licensed parent educator. A variety of classes and outreach activities are offered for families with infants, toddlers, and preschoolers with varied topics and interests.

What does a typical ECFE class include?

Parent-Child Activity Time

Families explore a classroom filled with developmentally appropriate play and learning activities planned by a licensed early childhood teacher. These experiences foster a child's social, emotional, cognitive, physical and language and communication skills.

Parent Education Time

Parents meet with a licensed parent educator to share support, experiences and information about child development and parenting. Discussions are focused on early brain development, parent-child relationships, social-emotional learning, behavior guidance, language development, thinking skills, and physical development.

Children's Activity Time

Children explore, gain independence, and practice social skills while interacting with the early childhood teacher and paraeducator.

INFANT/TODDLER

NEWBORN DISCOVERY BIRTH-12 WEEKS

Non-separating

For parents of newborns ages 0-12 weeks. Support and information will be provided through discussions that are facilitated by a licensed Parenting Educator, Public Health Nurse, and a Lactation Specialist and through connections with other parents and caregivers. Topics include: feeding, sleep, attachment, returning to work, family changes, and developmental milestones. Year Round

Congratulations on your new baby and welcome to Mankato Area Public Schools. Parents and caregivers are invited to register for one of our Great Start infant classes for support, more information, and to learn alongside other new parents. GREAT START 0-9 MONTHS Non-Separating

Bring your baby to play in our ECFE classroom! You will find age appropriate activities to enjoy with your baby, simple ways to encourage your baby's development at home, and meet other parents with whom you can share ideas, concerns, and successes.

BUSY BODIES 10-18 MONTHS Non-Separating

Rolling...Creeping...Crawling... Walking! Explore, play and learn with your little one alongside a licensed early childhood educator. Learn, support and grow with other parents and caregivers alongside a licensed parent educator. Topics range from child development to finding time for yourself.

BABY SIGN 3-18 MONTHS Non-Separating

As parents, we wonder what is going on inside their little heads as we wait in anticipation for their first words. By teaching your child gestures or signs as well as spoken words, they are more quickly able to understand and communicate with the world around them. Come and learn what sign language is all about. LITTLE WIGGLERS 13-24 MONTHS

Non-Separating

Your one year-old is busy, curious and ready to play! Together you and your child will play with a variety of toys, use art materials, learn songs and finger plays and enjoy lots of movement. A benefit of this class is that you and your child will remain in the same room together while parent discussion takes place.

MUSIC, MOVEMENT & BOOKS 13-28 MONTHS

Non-Separating

Come and enjoy music, movement and books with your toddler! During this class, we will use songs, books, and large motor skills to help foster literacy development, active learning, and physical health.

SHAKERS AND MOVERS 18-33 MONTHS

Separating

Toddlers are always on the move! Enjoy some one on one time with your child while they learn a variety of skills through play. As a caregiver, you will gain knowledge and support with other caregivers when you separate for parent discussion time.

YOUNG 2'S 18-30 MONTHS Gradual Separating

Toddlers are constantly on the go exploring with energy and wonder. That is their job. Join us in activities that encourage language development, selfhelp skills, and a variety of sensory activities. Gradually, as the class allows, parents will move on to the parenting education room. As a parent, you will gain knowledge and support from a licensed parent educator and other parents during discussion time.



AGES 2 & 3/MULTI-AGE

2'S-3'S YEAR OLDS 28-47 MONTHS FANTASTIC 3'S 36-48 MONTHS Separatina

Being a two or three year old is a very unique time in your child's life. Language development is emerging, social skills are developing and physical and cognitive changes occur rapidly. The class will have parent/child interaction time followed by a parent only discussion time lead by a Parent Educator. Children remain in the classroom to experience learning activities, such as sensory exploration, dramatic play, large and small muscle experiences, in addition to storytelling, music and other literacy-rich activities under the guidance of an Early Childhood Teacher.

FAMILY NATURE MEET-UP FOR 8 WEEKS BIRTH - 8 YEARS Non-Separating

Nature will be our guide as we explore, learn, and grow outside together. The Nature Meet-up is for all families whether you are an avid explorer with your little ones or just want to try something new. We welcome backpack babies and children birth - 8yrs. You, the parents, or caregiver, will stay with your children during the nature meetup. You get to explore and play too. Please come dressed to be outside. We'll be playing and hiking in all types of weather. Rain boots and raincoats make exploring more fun on wet days. Fall & Spring only

Separatina

Parenting your 3 year old is exciting, fun, and also challenging at times. Spend some time with your child in our ECFE classroom with other children and parents or caregivers who are having similar experiences. Children will be able to play, explore, and learn new skills with the guidance of a licensed early childhood educator. You will value time spent with other caregivers to discuss child development, challenges, proud moments, and gain support with a licensed parent educator.

BOOKS AND BEYOND 3-5 YEARS

Non-Separating

Dive into the world of imagination with your child through books. In this nonseparating class you and your child will experience art, math, science, music, and nutritional activities that will correspond with the books you'll be reading. Parenting tips will be shared.

MESSY ART 13-35 MONTHS OR 2-5 YEARS Non-Separating

"Paint, chalk, flour, oatmeal, glue, glitter, hands and feet..." What do all these items have in common? These are just a few tools we will use to "mess around" in our class. So, come prepared to explore, create, and have fun!

STEM CLASS 3-5 YEARS

Non-Separating

Help your child explore the world using their senses. Join us as we explore, investigate, calculate, & experiment with hands-on math and science concepts. Learn with your child how fun, easy, and important it is to incorporate math and science into your everyday life. This is a non-separating class taught by an Early

BUILDING EMOTIONAL INTELLIGENCE

Non Separating ages 12-24 months Separating ages 24-48 months

Building Emotional Intelligence" is a specialized parent-child class designed to foster social-emotional learning in children aged 0 to 5, while equipping parents and caregivers with the tools and knowledge to support their child's emotional development during these critical early years. Through ageappropriate activities, games, songs, and guided discussions, "Building Emotional Intelligence" provides a foundation for parents and caregivers to understand the importance of socialemotional development in their child's overall well-being. Led by licensed Early Childhood and Parenting Educators with expertise in early childhood development.

PARENTING FOR EQUITY Virtual

There is no perfect way to talk with young children about race, racism, equity, anti-racism, and justice. Let's do this together! With the guidance of a licensed parent educator, parents will explore how racial identity develops, share how to use children's books to aid in conversations, and examine what role parent's play in raising race conscious children. ONLINE PARENTING DISCUSSION GROUP

Virtual

Come join us for a 10-week journey exploring what is vital to a strong foundation of parenting! Topics will focus on attachment, brain development, social emotional learning, and parenting philosophy and goals. This online discussion will be lead by a licensed parent educator by sharing videos, information, and posting discussion questions. Parents can participate and respond to the discussion questions throughout the week as it fits their schedules. A biweekly chat will also be held for those who are able to participate every other Wednesday evening, but not required.





HELP ME GROW

WHAT IS HELP ME GROW?

- Help Me Grow provides resources for families to understand developmental milestones and learn if there are concerns. This helps families take the lead in seeking additional support, or referring their child for a comprehensive, confidential screening or evaluation at no cost.
- Help Me Grow is an inter-agency initiative of the State of Minnesota Department of Education, Department of Health and Department of Human Services. We partner with all local service agencies.

WHAT DO YOU NEED TO KNOW TO HELP A YOUNG CHILD DEVELOP, LEARN AND GROW?

EARLY CHILDHOOD SCREENING

Best to be screened at age 3 Required before Kindergarten Registration

Early Childhood Screening is a comprehensive developmental screening for children 3-5 years old.

The purpose of Early Childhood Screening is to...

- Increase parent understanding of child's health, development and school readiness
- Identify conditions and risk factors that may affect a child's ability to learn and develop, make referrals for further assessment
- Link families to parenting resources and preventive health care

A Parent Should Schedule an Early Childhood Screening because...

- It identifies, at an early age, any hearing, vision, growth or development needs.
- It gives the parent valuable information about their child, information about school readiness and community resources.
- It is required by the state of Minnesota before entrance into public school kindergarten.

HOME VISITING

Our Early Childhood Family Education Home Visit program is designed to provide individual support to parents and caregivers of children prenatal to age 5. A licensed parent educator will help support parents in their role as the most important and influential teacher of their child. For questions and to schedule an appointment with a home visitor, call the Early Learning Department at (507) 625-4620.

- Learn developmentally appropriate activities to support your child's development.
- A safe, confidential, environment to share and discuss personal issues related to parenting
- Develop a better understanding of the importance of strong positive relationships.

PAYMENT/SCHOLARSHIPS

Fees are payable by cash, check or credit card. Scholarships for parent/child classes in the form of a reduced fee or waived fee are available for families in need of financial assistance (ECFE Fee Scale). Registrant wishing to withdraw their registration must do so no later than one week prior to the course start date. No refunds will be given if withdraw is made less than one week prior.

IMMUNIZATIONS

Please bring a copy of your child's immunization records to the first class. If your child has not been immunized, we will need you to submit a signed exempt form to the Early Learning office.

SIBLING CARE

Sibling care is available for most parent/child classes. Please make alternative care arrangements for your child if sibling care is not available. You will register and pay for sibling care at the same time you register for your parent/child class. We ask that you provide one healthy snack item per term. You are welcome to visit your child in sibling care at any time.

WEATHER INFORMATION

On days when MAPS schools are closed or students are released early due to hazardous weather conditions, all ECFE Parent/Child classes are canceled.

FACILITIES ANNUAL NOTIFICATIONS

SCHOOL YEAR PESTICIDE NOTIFICATION

In compliance with the Parents Right to Know Act of 2000, Mankato Area Public Schools has an Integrated Pest Management Plan in place designed to minimize the risk to human health and the environment and to reduce the of chemical pesticides. Mankato Area Public Schools does not apply pesticides on school property unless all other measures have failed to control the problem. In the event that insect control sprays and dust need to be applied, it will only be done when students are absent from the areas, and will be out of the area until the spray and any odor has dissipated. If you would like to be notified prior to a chemical application, please contact the District Facilities & Safety office.

SCHOOL YEAR ASBESTOS NOTIFICATION

Mankato Area Public Schools, in accordance with the Federal Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act (AHERA), has a stringent inspection and management program for all asbestos containing building materials. The district strives to maintain a safe and healthful environment for our community's youth and employees. Every three years, all buildings owned and leased by the district are re-inspected for asbestos content by an accredited inspector with the **Environmental** Protection Agency (EPA). Every six months, materials containing asbestos surveyed are by district staff. materials Any needing repair or removal are done so safely and responsibly under our asbestos operation

maintenance program. and Mankato Area Public Schools has a list of locations and types containing asbestos materials found in our buildings. of asbestos copy the management plan is available for review in the District Facility office. Questions related to the plan should be directed to Scott Hogen, Director of Facilities and Safetv.

INDOOR AIR QUALITY NOTIFICATION

Mankato Area Public Schools has strong commitment providing and maintaining good air quality. Our schools follow EPA guidelines to improve our indoor air quality (IAQ) by preventing as many IAQ problems as possible, and by quickly responding to any problems that may arise.

FACILITIES ANNUAL NOTIFICATIONS CONT'D



Good indoor air quality requires an ongoing commitment by everyone in our schools because each of us make daily decisions and perform activities that affect the air quality. Throughout the year, air quality is monitored and air handling systems are maintained on an established schedule to ensure good air quality. Our District Health & Safety Department will follow up on any reported IAQ problems. The Mankato Area Public Schools has agreed to administer the IAQ Management Plan, which includes taking team a leadership role, coordinating emergency response, information serving as our resource. Questions should be directed to the District Facilities and Safety Office.

RADON SAFETY MANAGEMENT PLAN

To keep our students and staff safe, and because district leadership has placed a high priority on wellness initiatives — including radon testing — MAPS initiated a radon testing program in 2000.

Minnesota Statute 123B.571 requires school districts develop a Radon Management Plan which follows EPA and the Minnesota Department Health (MDH) quidelines testing for radon after any renovation to a building or HVAC system, or every 5 years and to reduce levels to below 4 picoCuries per Liter (pCi/L). Additional information and test results can be found in the Facilities Health and Safety section.

LEAD IN WATER SAFETY PLAN

Mankato Area Public Schools is committed to providing a safe

working and learning environment for employees and students. The district has developed a lead in water management plan and testing program that complies with Minnesota Statute 121A.3345, as well as recommendations from the Environmental Protection Agency's (EPA's) Lead Contamination Control Act (LCCA) of 1988 and the Minnesota Department of Health (MDH), and Minnesota Department of Education (MDE). Statute Minnesota 121A.335 requires public school buildings serving pre-kindergarten through grade 12 to test for lead in water every 5 years. This statute also requires school districts to make the results of the testing available to the public for review and to notify parents of the availability of the information. Additional information and test results are located in the Facilities Health and Safety Office.

SPECIAL EDUCATION SERVICES HELPING STUDENTS BE SUCCESSFUL

Mankato Area Public Schools serves students with disabilities from birth through age 21. Federal and state laws guide the school district in identifying, evaluating and serving students with disabilities. A team of special educators, general educators and families work develop together to Individualized Educational Plan (IEP) for students who meet the criteria for services. The team considers the student's present level of performance, identifies educational needs develops goals to meet those needs in the least restrictive setting.

Mankato Area Public Schools provides continuum a services for students with disabilities. Special instruction and services are provided in: autism spectrum disorders. blind-visually impaired, deafblind, deaf and hard of hearing, developmental cognitive disabilities, developmental delay, emotional or behavioral other disorders, health disabilities, physically impaired, specific learning disabilities, speech language or impairments traumatic and brain injury. Prior to age six, a child who needs special instruction and

services because of a substantial delay or identifiable physical or mental condition that hinders normal development is considered a child with a disability. Most students receive special education in their neighborhood school. The district also has specialized programs for students who need more support.

ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICES NOTIFICATIONS



Right to know

Parent(s)/guardian(s) of a student who attends Mankato Area Public Schools have a right to know about the professional qualifications of the teachers who instruct their child(ren). The Every Student Succeeds Act provides the right to ask for the following information about each child's classroom teachers:

- Whether the State of Minnesota has licensed or qualified the teacher for the grades and subjects he or she teaches.
- Whether the teacher is teaching under an emergency permit or other provisional status by which state licensing criteria have been waived.
- The teacher's college major; whether the teacher has any advanced degrees and, if so, the subject of the degrees.
- Whether any instructional aide or similar paraprofessionals provide services to your child and, if they do, their qualifications.

Private vs. public information—important to know

Information...what is private? What is public? The following information is provided to raise awareness about data privacy practices regarding student information.

Privacy rights

Education records are classified as private data on individuals by state law and are accessible only to the student's parent/guardian or a student who is at least 18 years old. The school district may not disclose private records or their contents summary except as without the prior written consent of the parent/guardian or the eligible student. In some cases, private records may not be parents accessible to and quardians. State law provides that certain information in a student's education records be accessible only to that student and to the parent/quardian under special circumstances, if at all.

Directory information

What is directory information? Directory information includes the student's name, address, number. telephone email address, photograph, date and place of birth, major field of study, attendance dates, grade level, enrollment status, participation officially in recognized activities and sports, weight and height of athletic degrees, team members, honors and awards received, the most recent educational agency or institution attended by the student, photographs of students taking part in officially recognized activities, sports and academic or nonacademic classes or programs and other similar information.

Note: Directory information does not include information about a student's religion, race, color, disability, social position or nationality.

Is directory information public?

Yes. A school district may disclose this information from a student's education records. However, if a parent/guardian or student chooses, the information will not be released without prior written consent except to school officials as provided under federal law.

Disclosure of data to military recruitment officers

The school district will release names, addresses and home telephone numbers secondary students to military recruiting officers within 60 days after the request date unless a parent/guardian eligible or student has refused in writing the release of this data to military recruiters. Data released under this provision may be used only to provide student information about military service. state and federal veterans' education benefits and other career and educational opportunities the military provides.

Do I have to release data to military recruitment officers?

A parent/guardian or eligible student has the right to refuse release of directory information to military recruiting officers and must notify the Mankato Area Public Schools' Administrative Director of Services in writing September 15 of each year. The written notification must include the names of the student and parent/quardian, home address, grade level, school, parent's legal

relationship to student and the information that should not be released to military recruiters without prior consent. Keep in mind that refusal to release the information does not affect the district's release school directory information to the rest of the public, including military recruiting officers. To make any directory information about a student private, follow procedures under "How do I directory information make private?"

How do I make directory information private?

A parent/guardian or eligible student must submit a written request that includes the student's name, home address, school, parent's legal

relationship and specific category or categories of directory information that should remain private to the building principal within 30 days after the date of the last publication notice. parents/quardians do not want their child's or eligible student's directory information released to military recruiting officers, the school district must be notified that the directory information should not be released to any member of the public, including military recruiting officers.

How do I obtain nondisclosures of directory information?

A written notice from the parent/guardian or eligible student should be sent to the

district's Director Administrative Services and must include the student's name, home address, school presently attended by student, parent's legal relationship to student (if applicable), specific categories of directory information not to made public without prior written consent, which shall be applicable for that school year.
