

## Construction History of Santa Paula Union High School

- 1889 – Santa Paula Academy, a private high school, opens its doors to 51 students.
- 1891 – The school becomes a public school, Santa Paula Union High School.
- 1915 – A three-story building replaces the original school house.
- 1933 – Plans for the present campus design began, which includes the 100 wing, the 200 wing, Bryden Gym, auditorium, and the library.
- 1939 – Campus as we know it today was dedicated.
- 1949/1950 – Industrial arts building constructed.
- 1949/1950 – Pool and pool building constructed.
- 1950 – Alterations to the Bryden Gym dressing rooms and showers.
- 1955 – Rooms 214 and 216 constructed.
- 1955 – Agriculture building constructed (now the warehouse).
- 1955 – Bryden Gym modernized.
- 1955/1956 – Football field project (as it would remain until 2011) completed.
- 1956 – Cafeteria building and Ed. Services building constructed. *Notably, the previous cafeteria building was located in the north half of the current library...*
- 1957 – Alterations to existing buildings, including the 200 wing.
- 1956 – McMahan Gym constructed.
- 1960 – First three classrooms of the former 300 wing (later known as the 500 wing) were constructed.
- 1960 – Library addition completed.
- 1963 - The next three 300 wing classrooms were constructed.
- 1965 – The last six 300 wing classrooms were constructed along with a toilet building.
- 1968 – Alterations to the pool building.
- Early 1990s – Campus modernized.
- Mid 1990s – 300 wing constructed.
- Mid 1990s – 400 wing constructed.
- 2004 – McMahan Gym and auditorium modernized.
- 2006 – Pool replastered.
- 2011/2012 – Track & field project constructed.
- 2013 – 500 wing (formerly 300 wing) and toilet building demolished as part of SPSHS S&T project.
