Community Survey Summary

Thank you to all who contributed to **Community Survey #2 – Feedback on the Options**, which closed on July 10th. This is a summary of the results.



When evaluating the options, what are your priorities?



Other Priorities people highlighted:

- Limited Disruption to Students
- Construction Duration
- Longevity, Ease of Maintenance
- Capacity & Efficiency
- Meet Current Needs and Adapt for Future
- Thermal Comfort and Air Quality
- Health and Safety

Maintaining the current grade level configuration received the most support from respondents. **(44.13%)**

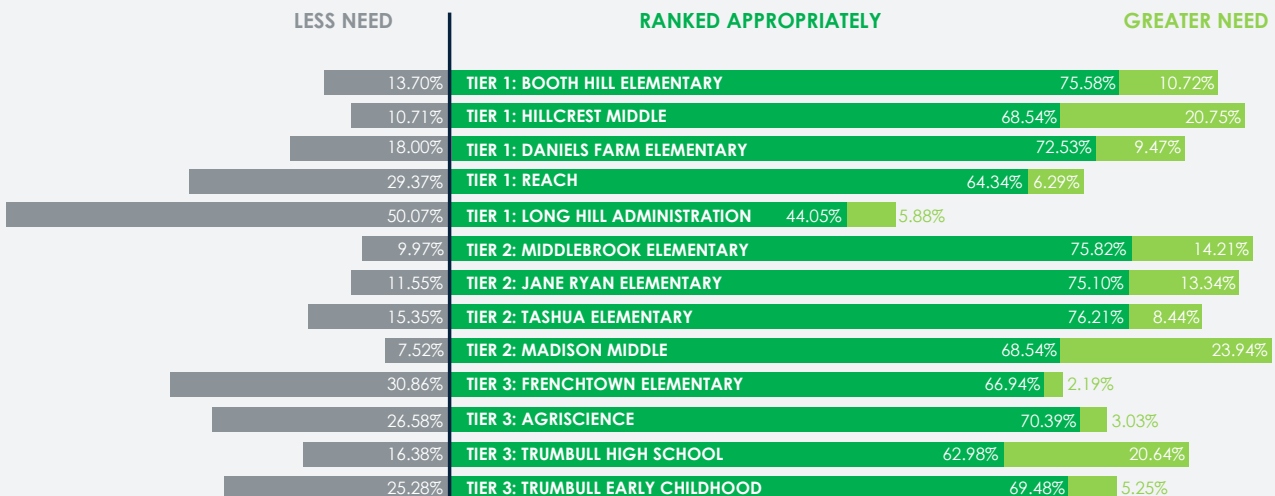
Maintaining the current number of transitions received the most support from respondents. **(46.38%)**

While some voiced support for consolidation, it was generally **not preferred** at either the elementary or middle school levels.

The additional feedback regarding total number of students per school revolves around the following core ideas:

- Keep neighborhood schools
- Solve for equitable class sizes and capacity issues across all schools
- Decrease in student population per school is preferred: maintain low student/teacher ratio
- Solve for future flexibility and growth potential

In response to current need allocations, the majority feel that the buildings are appropriately ranked in their tiers, with the exception of Long Hill Administration which is viewed as having less need.





OPTION 1: Middle School "Swing"

Build a new Hillcrest and use the existing building as swing space for Tier 1 elementary renewal.



OPTION 2: One at a time, please

Methodically replace Tier 1 buildings one at a time as either New or Renovate as New.



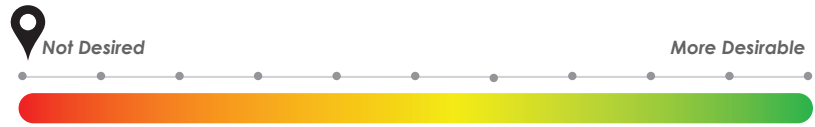
OPTION 3: "If it ain't broke, don't fix"

Resolve issues as they arise as part of a capital improvement program.



OPTION 4: Intermediate Introduction

Build two new intermediate schools (GR 4-5) on each side of the district to create swing space and flexibility at elementary level.



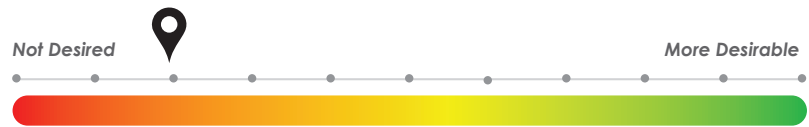
OPTION 5: Accommodating an Academy

Build two new academy schools (GR 5-6) on each side of the district to create space at both elementary and middle school levels.



OPTION 6: Integration Starting at 5th

Re-imagine Madison and Hillcrest as district-wide GR 5-6 and GR 7-8 schools (respectively) to create space at elementary level and bring students together earlier.



OPTION 7: District-Wide Middle School

Re-imagine Madison as district-wide GR 6-8 to bring students together earlier and free up Hillcrest campus for community amenities.
