It's been another busy month with projects breaking ground and many already underway as well as some fun upcoming events. But before you dive into all the great things that have been going on in Medford this month, I want to remind you that while we all love the hot weather, too much of it without the proper protection can be harmful, so please be sure to keep yourself safe, especially during heatwaves by checking out our <u>summer safety tips here</u>.

Below are a few of our July highlights:

- Earlier this week, we broke ground on a \$1.4 million renovation project at Gillis Park.
 Thanks to the support of our amazing community partners, like Medford Youth Baseball, the park will be getting upgrades like a rebuilt baseball field, improved accessibility, and more!
- We awarded over \$500,000 in American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funding to 17 local nonprofits that are supporting the community with COVID-19 recovery, specifically relating to issues like food insecurity, housing, and more. I'm excited to see the great projects and resources that will come to fruition as a result of these funds.
- Our Office of Prevention and Outreach has launched a community survey to gather
 public feedback on how Medford's Opioid Settlement Fund money should be used. The
 City is currently planning for over \$830K over 18 years, with the potential for more
 funding to come. Please take the survey and inform the resources and goals needed for
 our community!

be CLOSED for a few hours during the event so please plan accordingly!



Medford to Award Over \$500,000 in ARPA Funding to Local Nonprofits Supporting COVID-19 Relief Efforts

The City of Medford will be awarding over \$500,000 in American Rescue Plan Act funding to 17 local nonprofits that are assisting and supporting the community in several key areas related to COVID-19 recovery, Mayor Breanna Lungo-Koehn announced. The City is utilizing a portion of its remaining federal funds to award the one-time grants.

In the spring, the City launched its subrecipient application process and over the course of the last few months has been reviewing project proposals to ensure that its funding will have the most impact.

Medford Launches Community Survey to Inform Investment Strategy of Opioid Settlement Funds

The City's Office of Prevention and Outreach has launched a community survey to help determine strategies and goals for investing funds awarded from the Opioid Settlement Fund, Mayor Breanna Lungo-Koehn announced.

Medford will receive over an estimated \$830,000 over 18 years, with the potential for more funding to come, from a settlement of a July 2021 statewide class action lawsuit filed by Attorney General Maura Healy against opioid distributors and manufacturers to

The City is officially unveiling the completed Morrison Park Playground to the public at a ribbon cutting ceremony on August 7 at 10 a.m.

The new Morrison Park Playground is funded by a Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) that totals just over \$400K. The project brings a new preschool-aged play area to the playground, which includes a sandbox, swings, balance balls, and a new fishnet climber. The entire site was resurfaced with an accessible poured-in-place rubber surface and porous rubber surfacing was used to protect the roots of the large pine oak tree at the park.

Medford Breaking Ground on Accessibility Renovations and Upgrades to Gillis Park

The City of Medford will break ground on a \$1.4 million renovation project that will upgrade accessibility features, improve the baseball field, and add new park amenities to Gillis Park, Mayor Breanna Lungo-Koehn announced.

The project, funded through a grant from the Massachusetts Executive Office of Energy and Environmental Affairs' (EEA) Parkland Acquisitions and Renovations for Communities (PARC) Program, American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA), and Community Preservation Act (CPA) monies, will address two key issues: drainage and accessibility from the street.

Medford Residents Have Recycled 392 Pounds of Unwanted Clothing in June

Through its partnership with Helpsy, a textile recycling company, the city has been able to help residents recycle 392 pounds of unwanted clothing in June.

As the largest clothing collector in the Northeast, Helpsy partners with municipalities and organizations across 11 states to collect unwanted clothing and other textiles in order to keep clothes out of landfills. In 2021, the

Medford Opening Applications for Senior Work Off Real Estate Tax Abatement Program

The City of Medford Council on Aging and Office of the Assessor invites seniors, ages 60 and over, to apply for the Senior Work-Off Abatement Program. Through this program, seniors have the opportunity to lower their real estate tax payments by temporarily working for the City. Preference will be given to Seniors that have not participated in previous years.

The work program will begin on September 5, 2023, and must be completed on or before February 23, 2024.

National Night Out




Next week: the Medford Police Department's National Night Out is August 1 from 5pm-8pm at Hormel Stadium!
