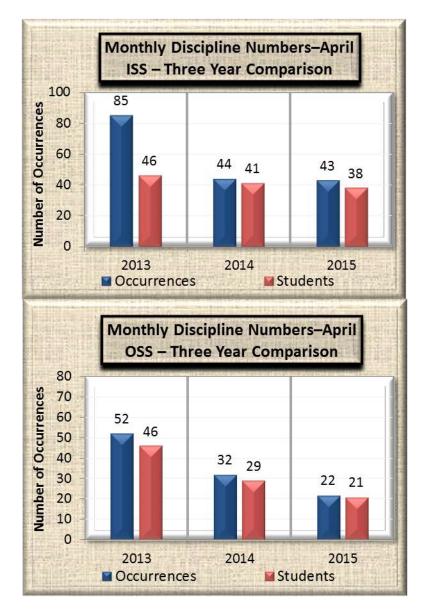

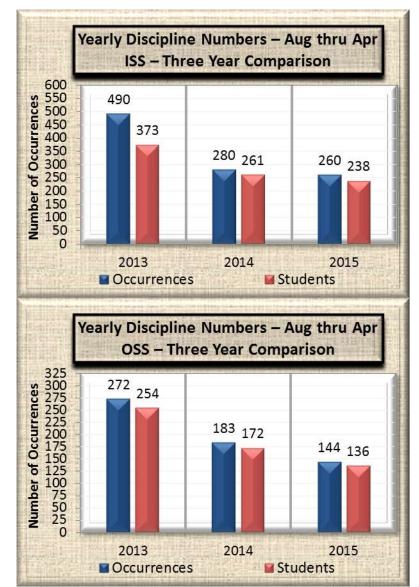

Bids were received for paving improvements on May 12. Three companies submitted bids. The proposal was broken up into a base bid and numerous alternates.

Base Bid – Cutting and patching areas in the west lot and the bus lane. Major work in the area on the south end of building near the exit to Ann Street where busses turn and delivery trucks and drop-off traffic creates chronic issues. This will be cutting 36 inches out and rebuilding the area. The area also has a catch basin in the middle which will be removed and the area will have new grades to improve drainage. Also, some additional sidewalk is added so pedestrians are not forced to walk through the lot exit.

Alternate 1 – This is a surface grind off and replace the west lot and the bus lane.

Alternate 2 – This for repairing the asphalt surface around the perimeter of the stadium track. There are numerous large cracks 2" to 4" wide which are a safety issue. The work generally involves cutting an 18 inch section repairing the base and resurfacing the section. There is a large area near the concession stand as well as near the southeast ticket booths that will be replaced. At this time it does not appear the these cracks have damaged the track itself.

Alternate 3 – This is grinding and resurfacing the small lot near the garage.

Alternate 4 – for patching and sealcoating the Geneva street lot. This lot is used for student parking.

Alternate 5a – this the replacement of the concrete steps at the auditorium entrance as well as replacing some broken sidewalks leading to the auditorium.

Alternate 5b – Additional concrete repair on the east side of the building.

The recommendation is to award the base bid and alternates 1, 2, 4 and 5a.

Evan's and Sons Blacktop, inc is the low bidder for a cost of \$231,925.00.

Dear Gordon,

On May 12, bids were received for the 2015 Parking Lot Improvements project. The Base Bid work includes the reconstruction of the exit drive to Ann Street where the bus lane and the student drop-off lane combine into the exit, adding sidewalks to cross Ann Street and patching the existing pavement in the bus drive and the west student parking lot. The exit to Ann Street receives a lot of traffic from both the bus lane and the student drop-off lane. Pavement failure in this area where heavy vehicles (buses and delivery trucks) are turning in opposite directions has been a chronic issue. The re-construction involves a new gravel base down 3 feet and heavy duty gravel base and pavement. In addition, there were 6 alternates which are listed on the attached bid tab.

Six paving contractors obtained bidding documents and three bids were received. As discussed, our recommendation is to proceed with the Base Bid plus Alternates 1, 2, 4 and 5a. Alternate 1 includes milling and complete repaving of the bus lane and west student parking lot instead of doing the patching specified in the Base Bid. Patching the lot will just fix the immediate issue of potholes in the lot; other areas will continue to break-up causing potholes. Milling and re-surfacing will last 15 years. Alternate 2 includes repairs to the many cracks in the asphalt walking path around the track and a complete replacement of an excessively cracked area near the concessions building. Alternate 4 is patching and sealcoating of the Geneva Street lot and Alternate 5a is replacement of the concrete steps/stoop at the auditorium entrance.

Alternate 3 includes milling and re-paving the garage parking lot. This lot is in fairly good condition and will probably last another 5 years. Alternate 5b is to replace some cracking sidewalks in the front of the building (from the Arcade to the Pool lot) but since this sidewalk will be used next year for construction traffic

in the anticipated science remodeling it would make more sense to replace them after that is complete.

As discussed earlier in the year, the High Lake policy 3804 requires amending to accommodate the capital improvement plan. A section is being added which authorizes a permanent withdrawal from the fund. In addition, the remaining balance is being amended to reflect the balance upon completion of the withdrawal.

The numbers contained in this draft are approximate. Actual numbers will be provided prior to the policy second reading at the June Board meeting.

3804 High Lake Property Sale Revenue

A. It is the goal and intent of the Board to retain funds generated from the sale of the High Lake property as a self-propagating source of capital within a sub-account created within the Capital Improvement Fund. To this end, the Board has created the principles set forth below to govern the retention of funds realized from this sale of property:

1. All revenue from the sale of High Lake land shall be deposited in a separate sub-account within the Capital Improvement Fund. This sub-account shall consist of High Lake funds in the amount of \$\$4,360,000 after withdrawals made pursuant to Section B.

2. The balance within the High Lake sub-account shall be retained from year to year unless specific action is taken by the Board to reduce such

amount by means of a withdrawal or borrowing. Either action can occur as a part of the annual budgeting cycle or as a way to address a bona fide emergency, deemed as such by formal action of the Board. In no event shall the aggregate amount of all withdrawals and borrowing exceed ten (10%) percent of the initial deposit in any fiscal year, and shall not exceed fifteen (15%) percent of said initial deposit within any three fiscal year period. Both withdrawals and borrowing must be utilized for capital projects at the discretion of, and approval by, the Board. A withdrawal need not be repaid to the High Lake account from which it was taken.

3. All borrowing under either the annual budgeting cycle or the bona fide emergency provision shall be repaid to the High Lake account, pursuant to a repayment schedule approved by the Board no more than two months after the approval of the withdrawal, borrowing, or expenditure. The Board may, at its discretion, include a charge for interest in the repayment plan.

4. Interest earned on the High Lake account created pursuant to this Policy shall be credited to the High Lake account, and shall be separately accounted for therein. Such interest may be utilized for capital projects at the discretion of, and approval by, the Board. Approved expenditures of interest made pursuant to this paragraph shall not be counted as a withdrawal for purposes of paragraph 2 or borrowing for purposes of paragraph 3 of this Policy.

5. All High Lake funds created pursuant to this Policy shall be invested, in accordance with applicable law, in funds based on taking advantage of secure and legal higher-yield options and cash flow needs.

B. Notwithstanding any provision to the contrary, The Board of Education hereby authorizes the permanent withdrawal \$ 2,500,000.00 for certain capital projects as delineated in the FY16 Budget.

Annually with the budget presentation, the Board shall receive a statement of balance for the High Lake account noted herein together with any withdrawals specifically approved by the Board.

Any and all actions required to be taken by the Board pursuant to this Policy shall require the affirmative vote of at least five (5) members of the Board. The amendment or repeal of this Policy shall require the affirmative vote from at least five (5) Board members.

The lease document will be provided as soon as we receive it.

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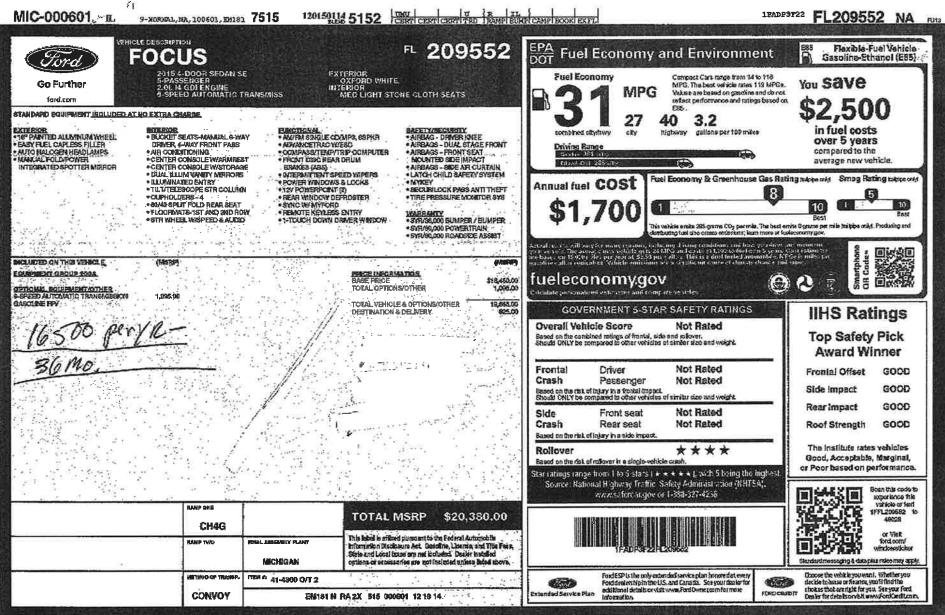
