AWARDS, RECOGNITIONS, HIGHLIGHTS

- Central Speech and Debate is the home to a national champion in Program Oral Interpretation.
- Bobcat Girls' Soccer were Bi-District Champions.
- Bobcat Football qualified for playoffs for the 14th season in a row as Bi-District Finalists.
- Bobcat Boys' Golf qualified to play in the Texas UIL State Golf Tournament.
- Central High School Marching Band won a 1st Division in UIL Marching for the 12th year in a row.
- Two students from the Central High School Band advanced to the All-State Band.
- Sixty-nine students from the Central High School Band earned First Division in both Solo and Ensemble contests.
- The Central High School Band earned a 1st Division from the UIL marching contest in the fall, and the UIL Sweepstakes Awards for the 12th consecutive years.
- The Central Collision Repair team swept the SkillsUSA chapter in automotive refinishing and collision repair.
- The Central High School Boys' Gymnastics team were District and Regional Champions. They also placed 7th place at State.
- The Central High School Tennis team were District Champions in Fall team tennis. They went on to win Bi-District and Area before falling in the Regional Quarterfinal round.
- The Central High School Tennis won District Champions in Mixed Doubles in the Spring and sent 3 teams to Regionals.
- Three Central High School students earned their Private Pilot Certification in conjunction with the United States Air Force.
- Members of the class of 2023 from Central High School were awarded over \$1,962,500 in scholarships.
- The Central High School Orchestra program has maintained a 39-year consecutive Sweepstakes at UIL Concert and Sightreading.
- The Central High School Chamber orchestra earned national honors in a contest for the Foundation of Music Education. This contest featured almost 500 schools from across the country, and Central was in the top 10 in their category.
