## Junior/Senior Student Privilege Form 1st Semester

Students may have Late Arrival (coming in for 2<sup>nd</sup> period), Early Dismissal (leaving 11<sup>th</sup> period), or Lunch Privilege. Students may indicate their preference, but decisions will be made based on scheduling. This form will need to be resubmitted for the second semester.

Privilege may be lost if the student fails to follow school rules and/or privilege guidelines. Administration reserves the right to deny, restrict, or remove privilege at any time based on academic, attendance, or behavioral issues. Juniors are permitted one privilege period per semester and seniors are permitted no more than two privilege periods per semester.

## General Criteria:

- 1. Student privilege release will not be granted unless this form is signed by the parent(s)/guardian(s) and is on file in the main office.
- 2. Students must be taking and passing five (5) courses each quarter and all fees must be paid to qualify
- 3. Student's schedules will NOT be changed to accommodate junior/senior privilege
- 4. Students must be in school or accounted for during the official school day. They may only leave during their assigned privilege periods on their schedule. If found leaving at other times without school authorization, the student will face loss of privileges and may face disciplinary consequences.
- 5. Students must have attained the appropriate grade-level status (e.g. credits)
- 6. Students must enter and exit through the attendance doors where they will follow sign-in and sign-out procedures. Students are to arrive no more than 5 minutes prior to the start of the period.
- 7. Students are not permitted to go to their locker until the bell rings for class change.

## Reasons for Loss of Privileges:

- 1. Suspension and other discipline consequences at the discretion of the administration
- 2. Cutting class
- 3. Greater than 65 hours of absence (excluding doctor's excuses, court appearances, or funerals)
- 4. Excessive tardies
- 5. Loitering in unauthorized areas of the school
- 6. Receiving an "F" in any class
- 7. Being in jeopardy of graduating or of failing a class
- 8. Remaining in parked cars or in the parking lot during privilege time
- 9. Loitering on the campus
- 10. Misbehavior in the community
- 11. Being on any other school grounds without authorization
- 12. Any other administrative reason

Participation in the privilege program is voluntary. Although students must follow both school rules and the rules/regulations of this program, the Westlake City School District will carry no liability for accident, injury, or a student's actions while a student is out of school on the student privilege program.

We have read and are willing to accept the above provisions governing the student privilege program.
