
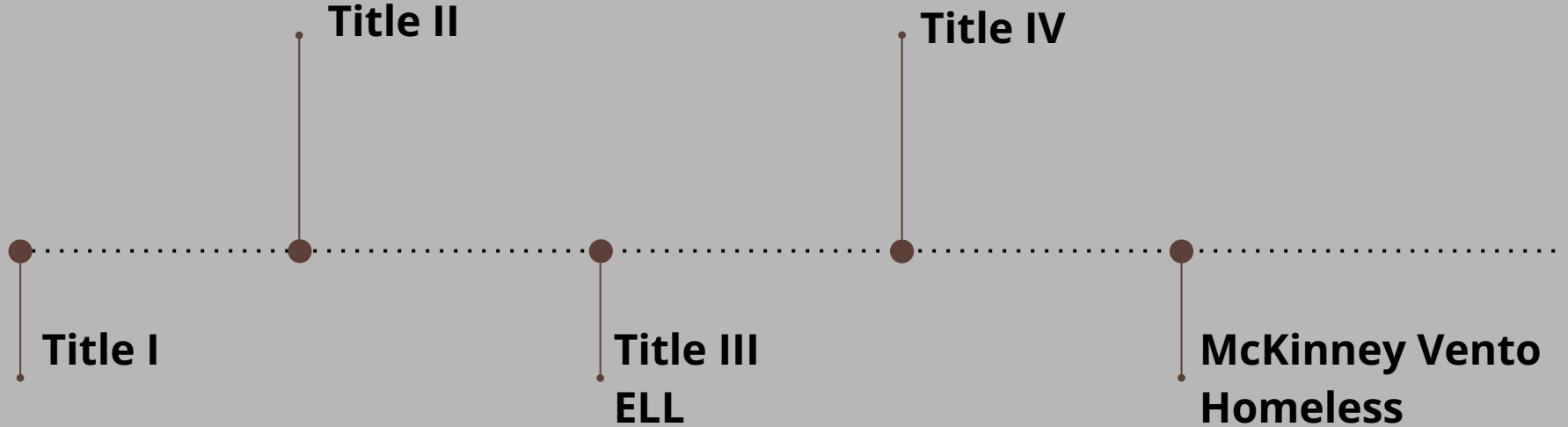

Our Programs



Title I

Title I was enacted to provide all students significant opportunity to receive a fair, equitable and high quality education and to close educational achievement gaps.

Components of Title I Schools:

1. Use Title I resources to help students achieve success in school. This may include developing programs, activities and academic courses necessary to provide a well rounded education.
2. Use methods and instructional strategies to strengthen the academic program of the school.
3. Coordinate with and support regular education programs, which may include services to assist pre-school students in transition from early childhood programs and Head Start to elementary school.
4. Provide opportunities for professional development with resources for teachers, principals, other school leaders, and paraprofessionals who work with eligible students in Title I.

Title II

Title II funds can be used to:

1. Targeted professional development to increase student achievement.
2. Improve the quality and effectiveness of teachers, principals and other school leaders.
3. Increase the number of teachers, principals and other school leaders who are effective in improving student achievement.
4. Provide economically disadvantaged students greater access to effective teachers and curriculum.

Title III

Ensures EL's including immigrant students and youth, attain English proficiency, develop high levels of academic achievement in English, and meet the challenging state academic standards.

Title IV

The purpose of Title IV funds are to:

1. Provide all students with access to a well-rounded education.
2. Improve school conditions for student learning.
3. Improve the use of technology in order to improve the academic achievement and digital literacy of all students.

McKinney Vento

The McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act (McKinney-Vento Act) (42 United States Code § 11431-11435) is federal legislation that ensures the educational rights and protections of children and youth experiencing homelessness.
