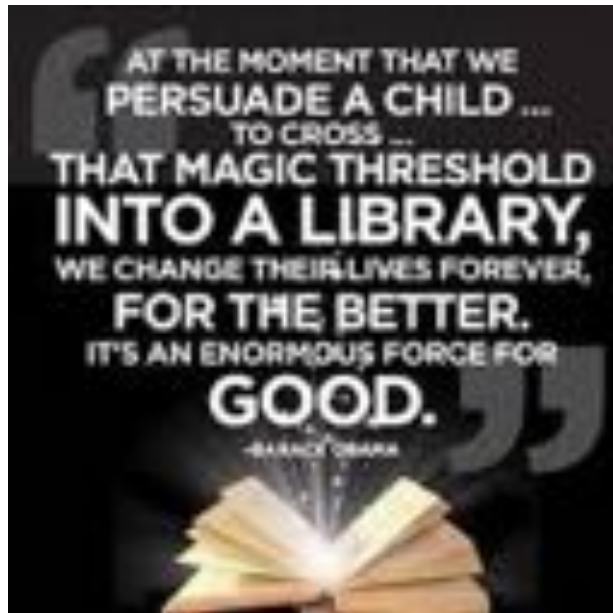

Reading comprehension requires more than just decoding and knowing the meanings of words — background knowledge is essential.

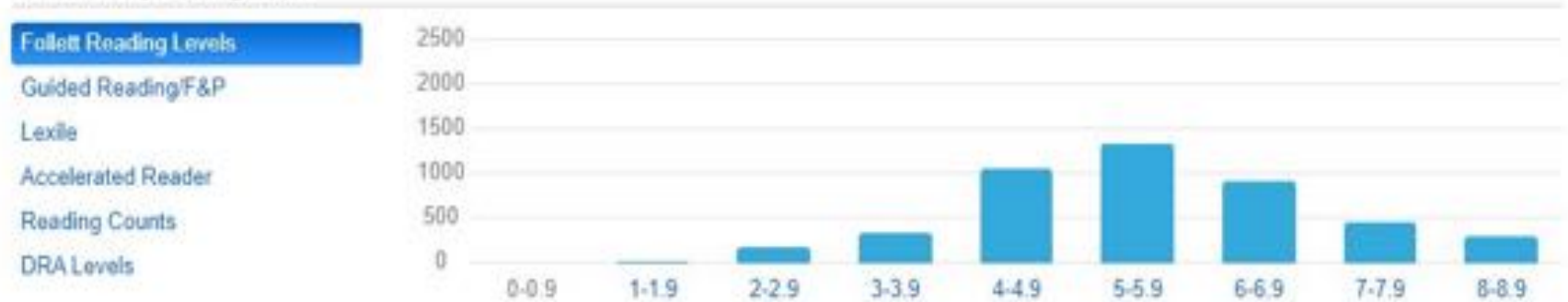
## Reading Levels

# Genres



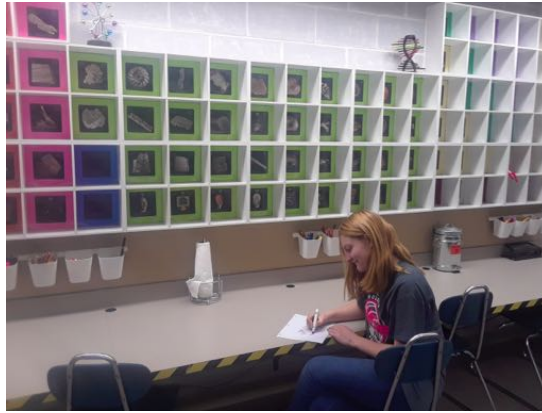
- Students enjoy the ease of having their books organized by genre

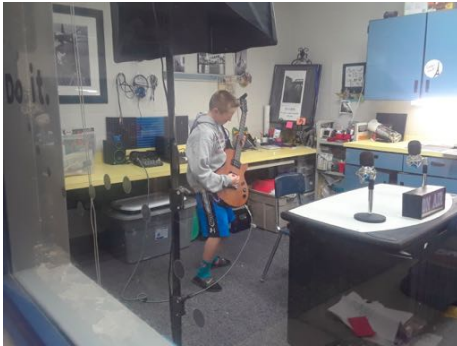

The studio is used daily. The students make infomercials, book trailers, choir and play practice and more.



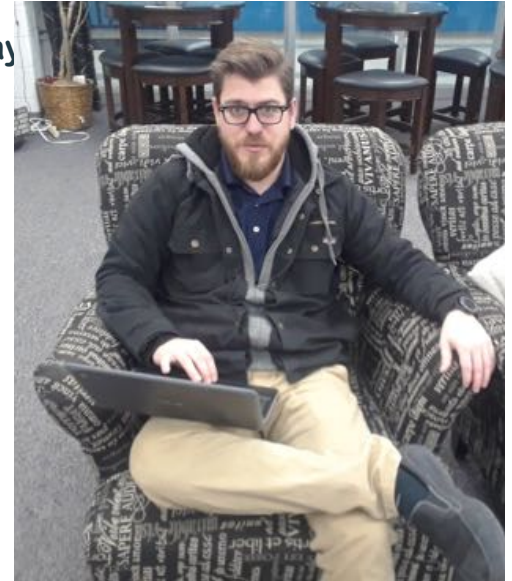
- Video recording studio with green screen

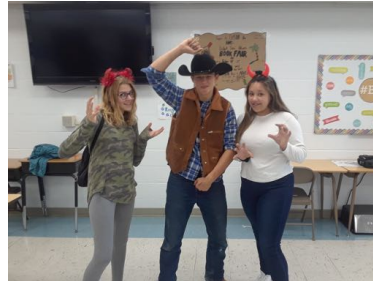

# Read Across America Week

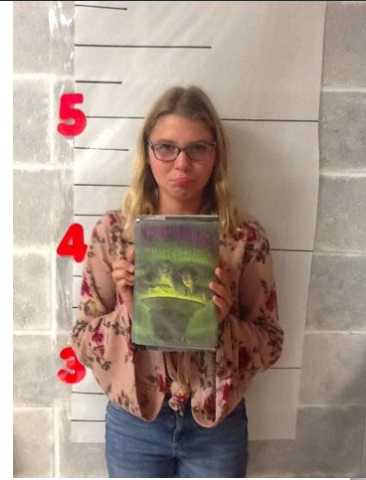
During the week of Dr. Seuss' birthday, the HMS library promoted reading in a variety of ways.

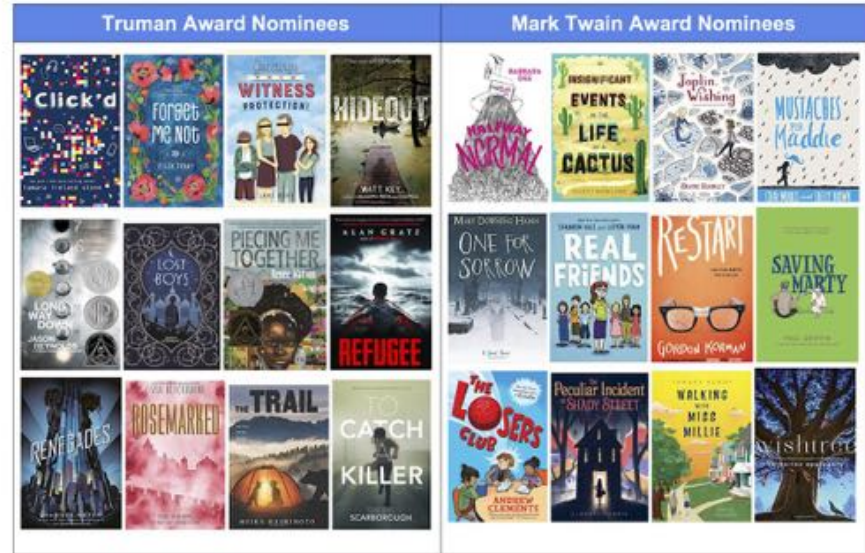

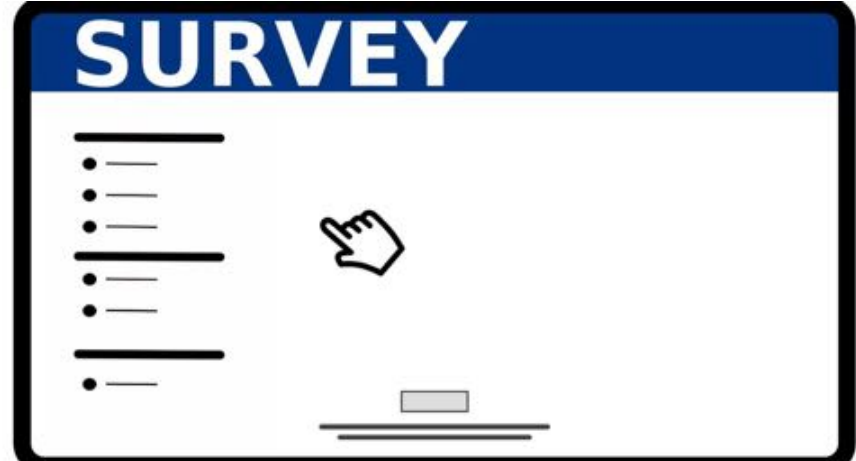
