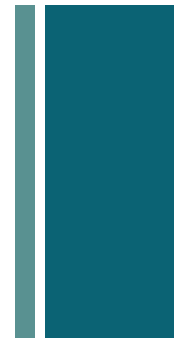
State Requirements for A+ Certification

- Be a U.S. citizen, permanent resident, or lawfully present in the U.S.
- Enter into a written agreement with your high school prior to graduation.
- Attend a designated A+ high school for 3 consecutive years immediately prior to graduation.
- Graduate with an overall grade point average of 2.5 or higher on a 4.0 scale.
- Have at least a 95% attendance record overall for grades 9-12.

Continued...

- Perform at least 50 hours of unpaid tutoring or mentoring, of which up to 25% may include job shadowing.
- Maintain a record of good citizenship and avoid the unlawful use of drugs and/or alcohol.
- Beginning with the high school senior class of 2015, have achieved a score of proficient or advanced on the Algebra I end of course exam or a higher level DESE approved end-of-course (EOC) exam in the field of mathematics.

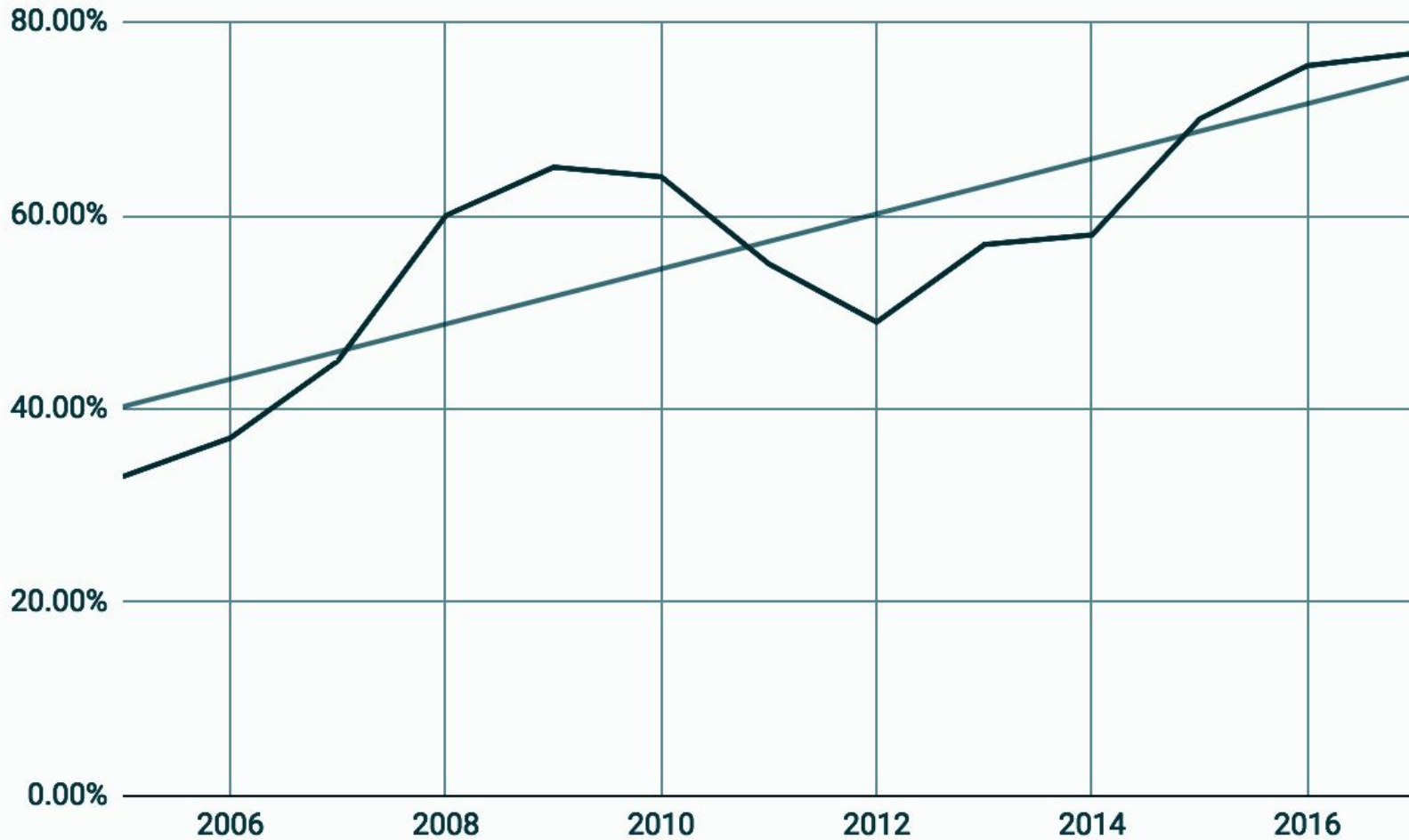
2018 High School seniors--If you meet all of the eligibility requirements except the EOC exam requirement, you can establish eligibility by achieving a combined ACT math subscore and high school GPA in accordance with following scale:

ACT Math Score		High School GPA
17 or greater	and	2.5 or greater
16	and	2.8 or greater
15	and	3.0 or greater

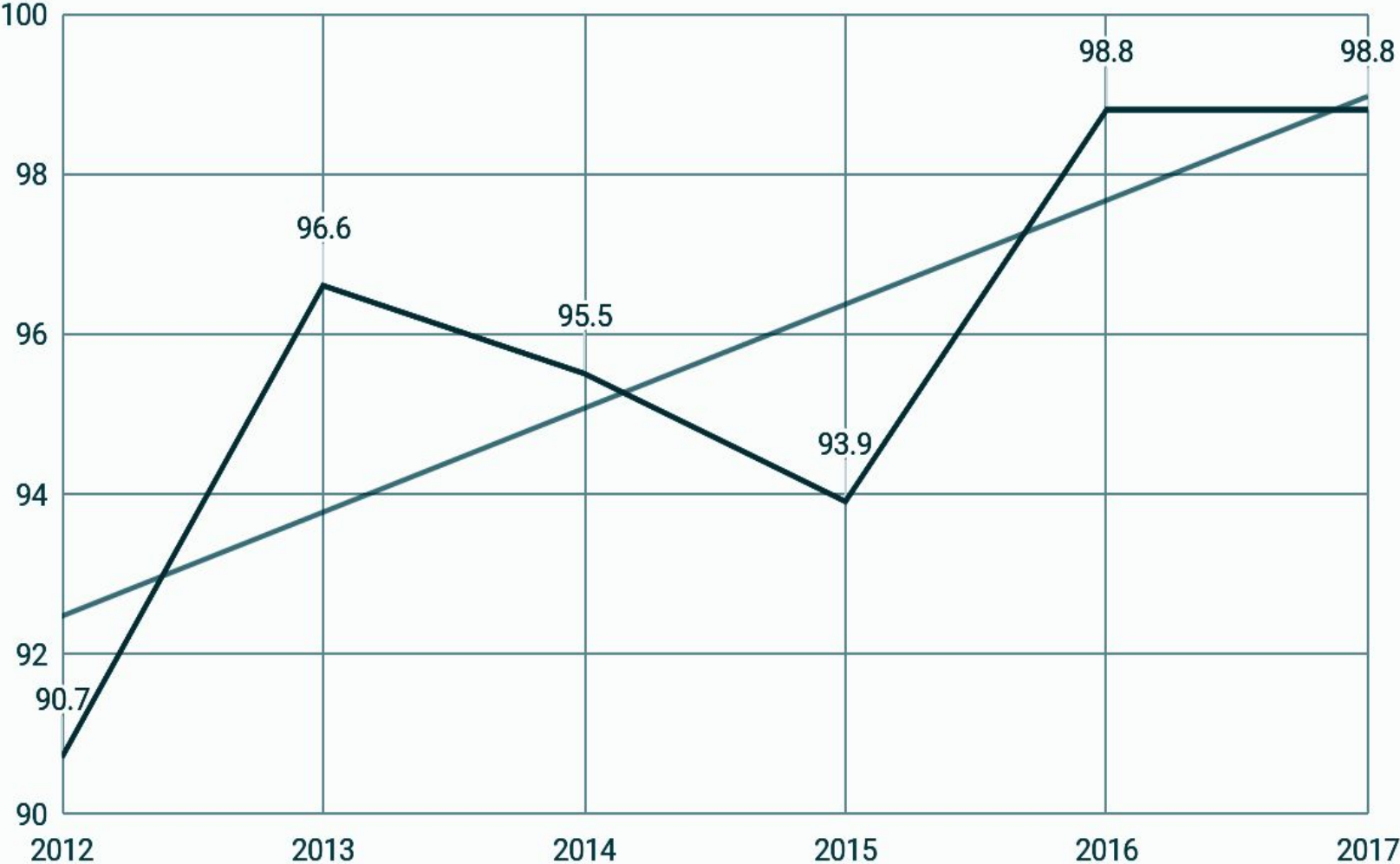

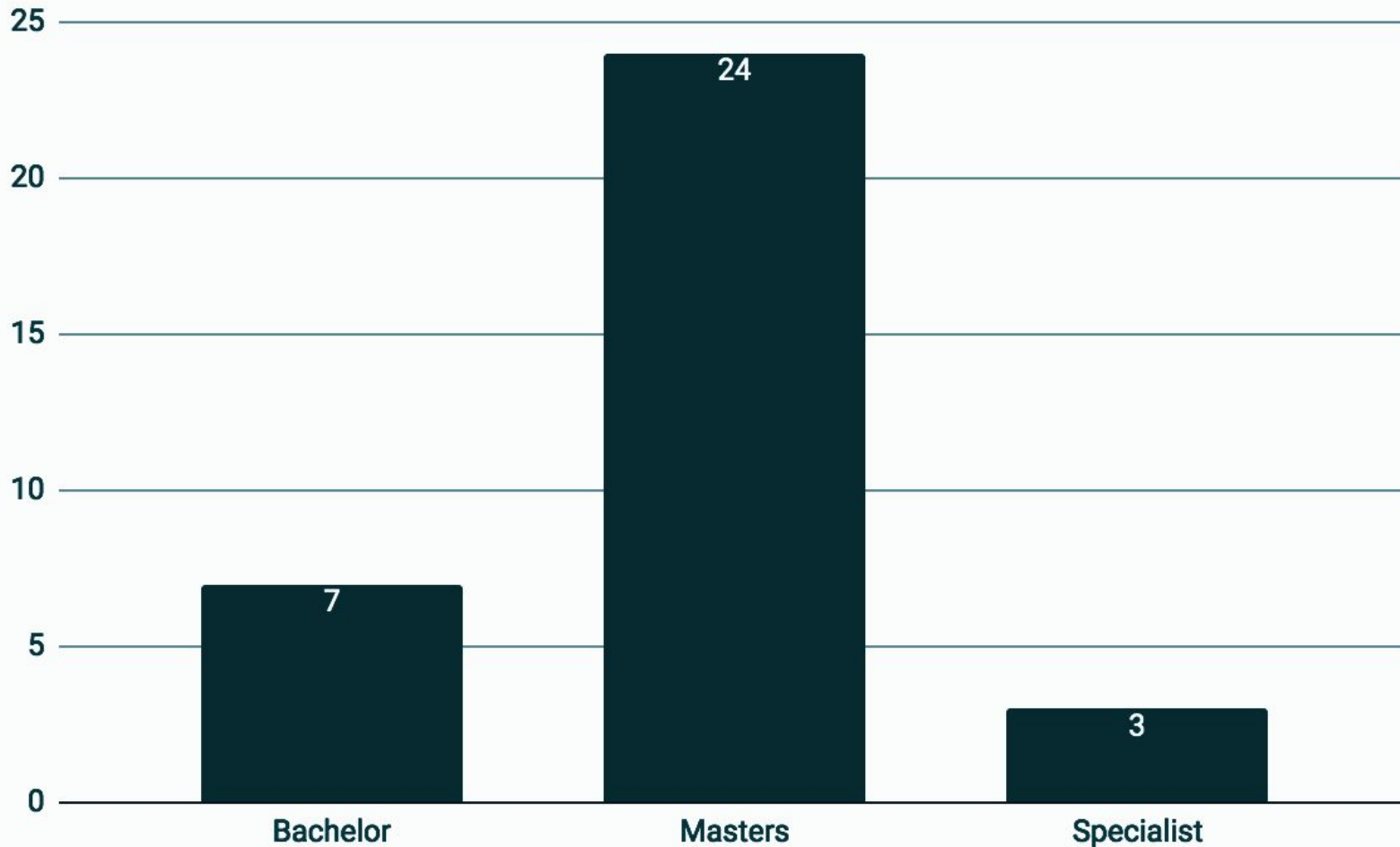

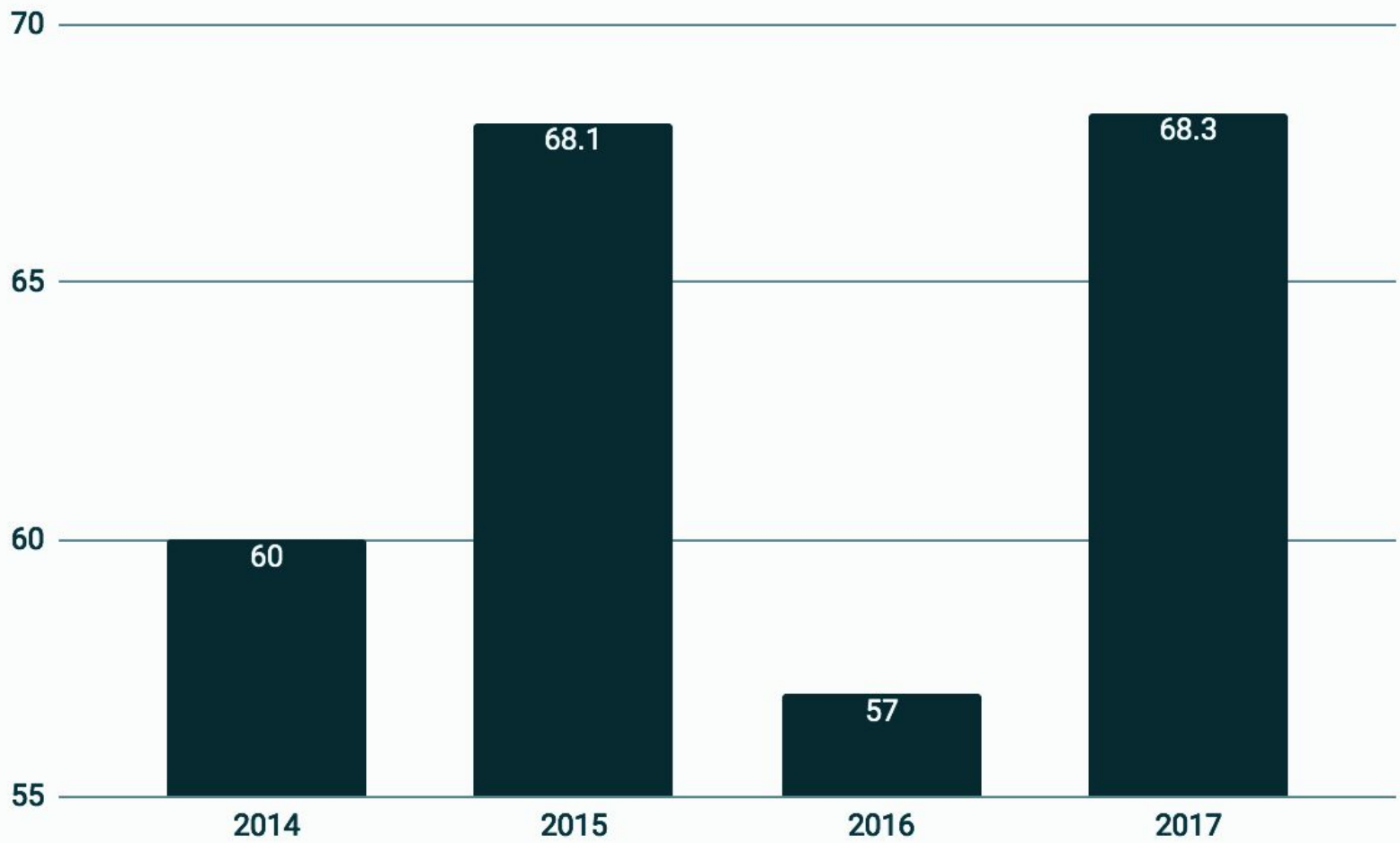

A+ Tutoring Requirement



In order to qualify for the A+ financial incentive, students are required to perform at least 50 hours of unpaid, school-based tutoring/mentoring.

The tutoring/mentoring activities must:

- Provide, as an ultimate goal, encouragement to lower grade students to get excited about school, stay in school, and strive for good grades.
- Be a part of an approved program and performed under the direct supervision of a certificated employee of the Holden School District.
- Tutoring must be performed in one of the public school buildings within the Holden School District.
- Tutoring must be performed with Holden School District public school students.
- Students may obtain a Tutoring Log sheet from the A+ office.

A+ Tutoring Requirement

- Juniors and seniors may enroll in the mentoring class,. Students will learn how to tutor, be placed with a teacher to do the tutoring, fulfill class requirements, and receive a grade. This will count for $\frac{1}{2}$ elective credit and may be repeated for additional elective credit.
- Students may tutor during summer school.
- Students may make other special arrangements, as approved individually, by the A+ Coordinator.
- Each entry on the tutoring log must be verified by a signature of the supervising teacher. Unverified time will not be credited.
- Log sheets must be turned in to the A+ Office before the end of the semester, during which tutoring occurred, to be included in the semester report to parents. It is the student's responsibility to maintain their log record and turn it into the A+ Office in a timely manner.
- Failure to adhere to tutoring guidelines may result in disciplinary action, and/or dismissal from the A+ Program.

Opportunities for Student Tutoring



- **Students as Mentor Program**
 - Coursework developed and monitored by A+ Coordinator
 - Students complete Tutoring Logs, Teacher Evaluations and Semester Reflection Paper
 - Application Process with course requirements
 - 95% Attendance Requirement
 - 2.5 G.P.A Requirement

- **Summer School Program**
 - Student can sign-up for the month long program to work and tutor one on one or in small groups with lead teachers.
 - Student can complete all of 50 hour tutoring requirement in a single summer

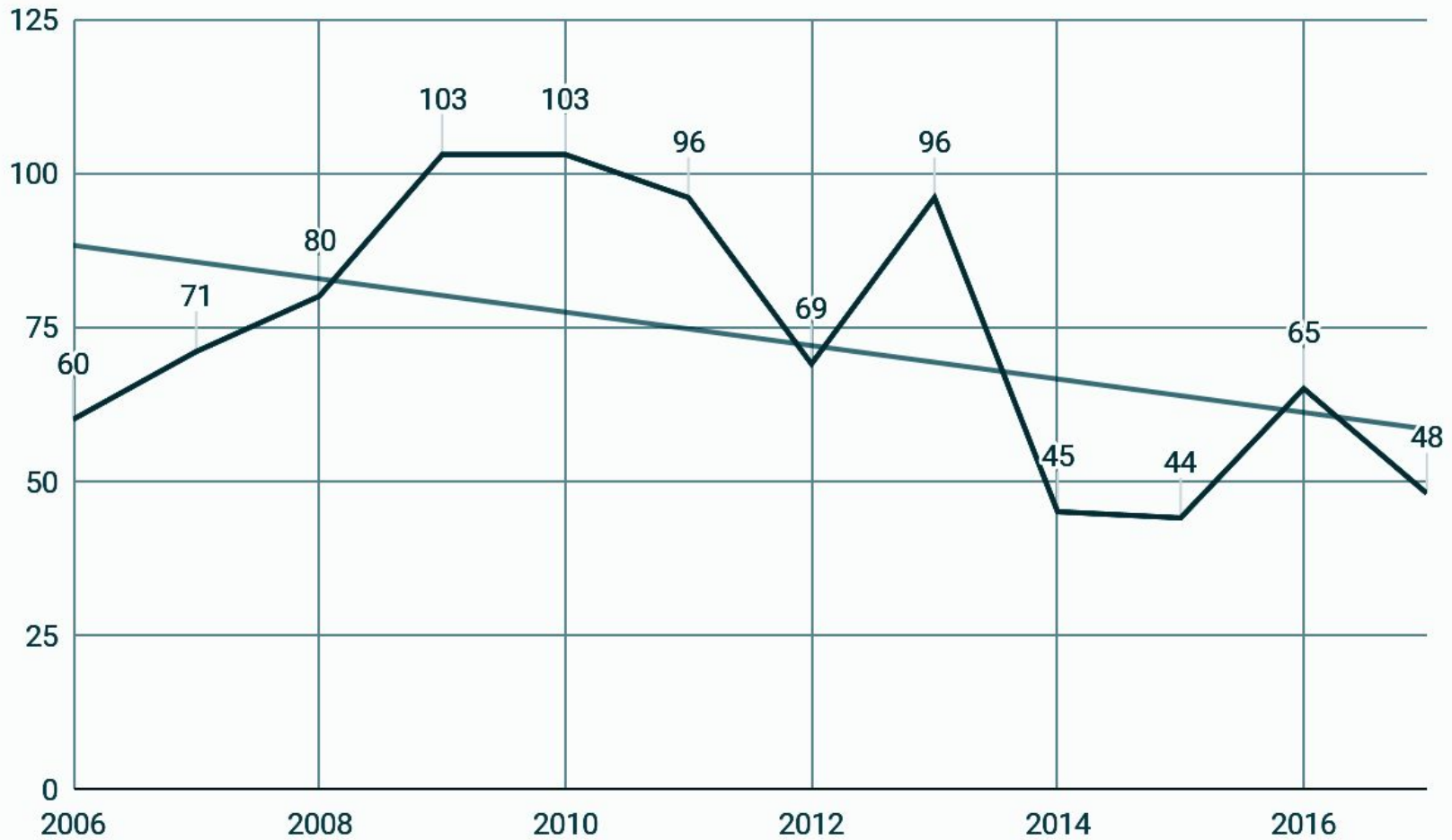
