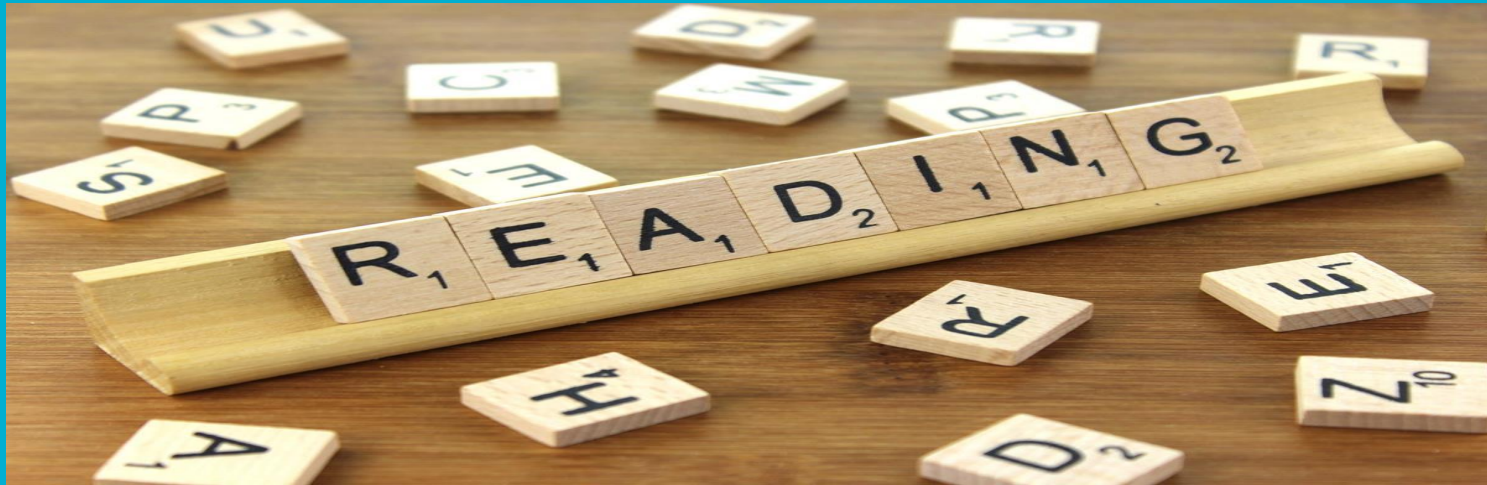

7:20a.m-8:10 a.m

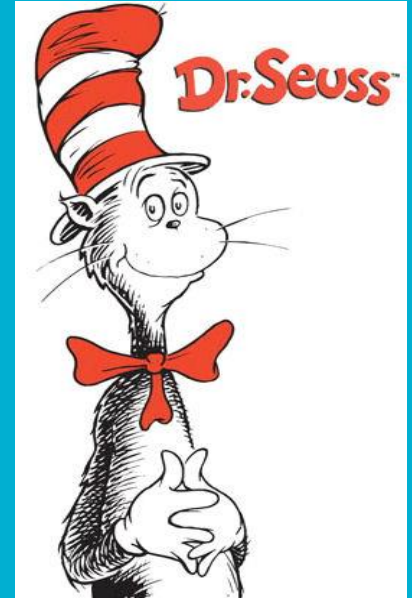
Very well attended. Grand parents shopped with students and enjoyed muffins, yogurt parfaits, juice and water. The food was provided by OPAA.
