~ Our History ~

The Yakima School District Alternatives Program began in 1969 with one class taught by Lawrence Countryman, a teacher at A.C. Davis High School. In the late 1970's, there were enough alternative classes being offered for secondary school students that the alternatives program was relocated to the Madison School on Fourth Street. As a result of a district facilities study, the Madison building was sold and, in 1987, the alternatives program was relocated to the Union Gap Stanton property located at 901 West Whitman.

That building, formerly Stanton Elementary School, was built in 1955 by the Broadway School District. Stanton Elementary School was named for one of that school district's most distinguished teachers, Florence Stanton. Mrs. Stanton came to the Yakima Valley from Wisconsin with her parents in 1889, the year Washington became a state. She attended Woodcock Academy in Ahtanum and Ellensburg Normal School. Mrs. Stanton was active in several historical interest societies. In 1987, the school became part of the Yakima School District.

In 2009, Yakima voters passed a \$114 million bond issue with a nearly 70% approval rate. State matching funds brought the total to more than \$218 million to go towards the replacement of Eisenhower High School, modernization of Davis High School, and extensive work at four elementary schools and Stanton Academy. Over the next year, the school board determined it would be best to relocate Stanton into the City of Yakima and within the Yakima School District boundaries. Property was purchased at 802 River Road and additional district funds were allocated for construction of a new Stanton Academy at that site. The new school was built at a total cost of about \$12.6 million and officially opened on August 29, 2012.

The design of the new Stanton provides more space, increased technology, and flexibility for expansion, as well as heightened security. Stanton Academy opened its doors this fall with 40 staff members, including 18 teachers, and more than 300 students.
