| -Explain that when people deposit money into a bank (or other financial institution), the<br>bank may pay them interest. Banks attract savings by paying interest. People also deposit<br>money into banks because banks are safe places to keep their savings.     |
| -Discuss that interest is the price the borrower pays for using someone else's money.   |
| -Identify instances when people use credit, that they receive something of value now and  |
| agree to repay the lender over time, or at some date in the future, with interest.  |
| -Explain that after people have saved some of their income, they must decide how to invest their savings so that it can grow over time.   |
| -Explain that a financial investment is the purchase of a financial asset such as a stock   |
| with the expectation of an increase in the value of the asset and/or increase in future income.   |
| -Explain that risk is the chance of loss or harm.   |
| -Explain that risk from accidents and unexpected events is an unavoidable part of daily life.   |
| -Describe ways that individuals can either choose to accept risk or take steps to protect themselves by avoiding or reducing risk.  |
| -Discuss that one method to cope with unexpected losses is to save for emergencies.   |
