We are pleased to be able to serve your student nutritious meals planned with popular student choices. If there are any comments or suggestions you would like to make to help us better meet your student's needs and desires for meals, please do not hesitate to let us know.

We would like to inform you that if your student is attending any Elementary School in the Tulsa Public Schools district, their breakfast and lunch meals will be at no cost. In addition, you will not need to fill out a meal application. However, if your student is attending Middle School or High School, a meal application will be available to you at: [www.tulsaschools.org/mealapp](http://www.tulsaschools.org/mealapp).

30-day cutoff will be **September 29, 2023** for **Middle and High Schools**.

After the date listed above, meals will be charged at the following rates if not approved for free or reduced price meals:

**SECONDARY SCHOOL BREAKFAST    \$1.20**  
**SECONDARY SCHOOL LUNCH        \$3.10**

Not only does your student benefit from this program physically and nutritionally, but educationally as well. For every student approved for free or reduced price meals, the school district receives additional funding to use for educational purposes.
