



Uniform Quick Start Guide

Daily Uniforms

Pants/Shorts/Skorts: Khaki shorts (boys), skorts (girls), or pants purchased through Risse Brothers only that fit properly, and are worn at the waist (no rolling, hemming, altering, etc.).

Belt: We may require a belt to ensure uniform bottoms fit properly.

Shirt: Students must wear the green collared polo shirt with MCC round crest purchased through our official supplier; seniors may choose to wear the white version of the same shirt.

Undergarments: Students may wear a solid white, green, gray, gold, or black long or short-sleeved t-shirt under the polo shirt; undergarments may not be visible through the uniform.

Shoes: Closed toe, closed heeled, and worn as designed (we prohibit flip flops, sandals, slides, slippers, Crocs, etc.). Must be conservative and must not serve as a distraction to the academic environment. The administration reserves the right to determine if shoes are appropriate.

Socks: Socks must be worn and not serve as a distraction to the academic environment.

IDs: Students must wear their student ID cards at all times, on a lanyard around the neck.

Outerwear

We permit school-approved sweatshirts and jackets but do not permit hoodies during the school day. Students must wear uniform shirts under all approved outerwear. We do not permit pillows and blankets on campus during the school day.

Accessories/Hair

- We do not permit body piercing, nose rings, tattoos, link chains, or drawing on the arms and legs.
- Female students may wear earrings, modest and appropriate for school.
- We do not permit male students to wear piercings or earrings of any kind.
- Male students' hair must be well groomed and appropriate for a Catholic school environment; the administration reserves the right to determine what is appropriate.
- We permit dreadlocks and braids for male students provided they meet our requirements; we do not permit tails or bandanas.
- We do not permit hair-modification of any kind to an unnatural color, contrasting unnatural colors, extreme styles and cuts, or shaved heads.
- Students must be clean-shaven every day. Students who arrive at school with facial hair may be subject to discipline and must shave.
