APPROVAL OF MINUTES

On a motion by Mr. Roberts and a second by Mr. Duhon, the Minutes of November 9, 2021, were approved on a unanimous vote.

PRESENTATIONS

Jamey Rasberry, Director of LCMH Sports Medicine, presented the quarterly report.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

I. You have each received the monthly Head Start report:

- A Policy Council Meeting was held on November 15th. The following items were approved:
 - ✓ September's Policy Council minutes
 - ✓ September's and October's Director Reports
 - ✓ September's and October's Attendance and Financial Reports
- The 3rd Annual Head Start Community Health Fair was held at J.D. Clifton Head Start. Over 400 students and 70 parents participated in this event. 25+ community resources were represented such as SWLA Health Center, Healthy Blue, and Louisiana Healthcare Connection.
- Staff participated in the Louisiana Early Childhood Association (LAECA) Conference virtually.

Effective Nov. 30, 2021, the [Head Start Program Performance Standards](#) reflects staff vaccination and universal masking requirements. Requiring all Head Start staff, some contractors, and volunteers to be vaccinated against COVID-19, and universal masking for all individuals 2 years of age and older. Everyone who is 2 years of age and older must wear a mask in indoor Head Start settings with these exceptions:

- Children who are eating or drinking, napping, or brushing teeth
- A child who has a special health care need, and their health care provider advises the family that their child should use an alternative face covering
- Children who cannot safely wear a mask because of a disability as defined by the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA)

2. You have all received the school population report, showing the student numbers from the end of October to the end of November, 2021.

3. I would like to report our November, 2021 sales tax numbers for our general fund which show collections at \$333,865 or 2.3% above budget for the 5th month of the 2021-2022 school year.

- Collections are \$670,605 or -4.3 % below collections for the same month last year.
- After five months, collections are \$15,453,360 or 25.0 % above budget and \$14,749,452 or 23.6 % above the same period last year.

4. Hurricane Information: Updates were included in your packet on contractor status returning to jobs. Staff is working with CSRS to determine path forward for a bid schedule for remaining projects that will work with cash flow.

5. We are glad to announce that the sales tax renewal passed this past December 11th. and want to thank everyone involved for the last several months to be sure the public was aware of how important that renewal tax was for our district.

6. Jesse Busby, Chief Executive Officer of the Calcasieu Teachers and Employees Credit Union, has invited all board members to the ground breaking ceremony for their new building at the corner of Southpark and McNeese, Wednesday, January 19th, at 10:30 a.m.

7. You received information regarding the 2022 LSBA Convention that will be held in Baton Rouge, March 6-8, 2022. Please contact my office by January 15th if you would like to be registered.

8. Please remember that we are all required to take the one hour Ethics computer based training by December 31st and a report has to be made to LSBA of all board members completing the course by submitting the certificate of completion. If you haven't already done so, please send your certificate to Peggy for your file.

9. We were all saddened to learn of the accidental death of Commander Brian Bourgeois, the Commander of Seal Team 8, in Virginia Beach, Virginia this past week. Brian's parents are from Lake Charles and Brian attended St. John Elementary, S.J. Welsh Middle, and then Barbe High School for the 9th and 10th grades, before moving to Katy, Texas. He went to the Naval Academy after graduating from high school in Katy and received his commission in 2001. Many of his family members have been educators with our district and we extend our deepest sympathies to them and to his wife and children.

The Calcasieu Parish School Board Employee Benefits Committee met in the Board Room at 3310 Broad Street, Lake Charles, Louisiana, on Thursday, December 9, 2021, at 5:00 p.m. The meeting was called to order by Mr. Mike Hill. Mr. Hill gave the invocation and led us in prayer. Ms. Mary Margaret David led the Pledge of Allegiance.

No formal action was taken, but the members present received the following information on the status of the health insurance plan from Kathy Sonnier with Insurance Resource Group of SWLA

Overall Claim Utilization for the time period

May – October is \$24.5M or 2% higher than the same period last year. The increase was due to lack of usage in the previous year due to Covid and Hurricanes.

- Implemented a new Medicare Advantage plan for retirees on July 1st saving the members and plan money overall. It's too early to know the full impact to the plan. Risk Management is continuing to monitor closely.

- Explore additional reinsurance options – by illuminating the purchase of reinsurance coverage, there is a savings of 1.37M to the plan as of October 2021.

AND WHEREAS, it is the desire of the Calcasieu Parish School Board to use the excess sales taxes dedicated and accumulated in the General Fund to provide a one-time salary supplement to active employees of the Calcasieu Parish School Board for services rendered in the fiscal year 2021-2022 and is to be paid on the December 17, 2021, regularly scheduled pay date,

AND WHEREAS, an employee is defined as an individual actively working full-time or part-time in their respective position and employed by the Calcasieu Parish School Board on December 1, 2021, (excludes board members and substitute labor),

AND WHEREAS, this supplement is being provided conditioned on employees completing their respective scheduled days to be worked for the 2021-2022 fiscal year and any employee not fulfilling this requirement is subject to having the supplement prorated by the Superintendent and surrendering any portion not earned,

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that all employees based on the teachers' salary schedule shall be paid a gross supplement of \$5,445 and all other personnel shall be paid a gross supplement of \$3,810 with one-half of the appropriate supplement paid to employees classified as part-time, and that any exceptions to the preceding definitions and rules will be resolved by the Superintendent and that said supplement is to be paid on the December 17, 2021, regularly scheduled pay date,

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that requests by employees to make a change to their federal withholding form W-4 or state withholding form L-2 received after November 30, 2021, will not be honored until January 3, 2022.

**Memorandum of Understanding
Between
Fire Protection District No. 1 of Ward 8 and Calcasieu Parish School Board**

The following Memorandum of Understanding is entered into by and between Fire Protection District No. 1 of Ward 8 (hereinafter referred to as "Fire District") and the Calcasieu Parish School Board (hereinafter referred to as "CPSB") to allow the Fire District to temporarily use an area of property directly south and adjacent to property currently authorized for use by the Fire District pursuant to a Joint Services Agreement currently in force until 2099 between the two parties.

Points of agreement are as follows:

- The Fire District shall be allowed to temporarily use an area of property (approximately 104 feet x 60 feet) directly south and adjacent to property currently authorized for use under the same terms, conditions and provisions as the existing Joint Services Agreement while repairs are made to Fire District

structures damaged by Hurricane Laura in August 2020,

- The Fire District will be allowed to construct a concrete slab and other necessary structures on said property according to its specifications to allow for parking of Fire District fire fighting vehicles and equipment,
- Upon expiration of this M.O.U., any improvements made to the property shall remain in place and become property of the school board and authorization for use shall cease absent any agreement to the contrary,
- The point of contact for the Fire District shall be its duly authorized secretary and the point of contact for the CPSB shall be its Chief Financial Officer.

This memorandum of understanding shall remain in full force and effect for a period of three (3) years from the date executed by both parties or until such time as the property is no longer needed for use by the Fire District and the CPSB is so notified.

Transitions to Pre-Kindergarten

"The Head Start Approach to School Readiness means that children are ready for school, families are ready to support their children's learning, and schools are ready for children." The Calcasieu Parish Head Start program provides a comprehensive focus on physical, cognitive, and social and emotional development, all of which are essential to children becoming ready for kindergarten.

The Calcasieu Parish Head Start program has an integrated curriculum in place that addresses the essential domains of school readiness in the Head Start and Early Learning Framework. Child level assessment data is collected and entered three times a year through the use of the assessment tool Teaching Strategies Gold. The information collected is shared with the parents twice a year. Parental partnerships are encouraged that promotes an understanding of the child's progress, provide support, and encourage learning. There is also ongoing communication with the local schools to exchange information about the children and programs and to align services for early learning, health, and family engagement.

Calcasieu Parish Head Start students and parents were provided several opportunities to learn about and prepare for the upcoming school year. Parent sessions were held at the Head Start sites to provide information regarding the online registration process. The goal of these meetings was to inform parents with the online registration process. The first online application process was held in April 2021. There were several application submission dates throughout the calendar year. Parents were provided access to computers Monday-Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. located at 2001 Russell St.

Families of students that enroll in Head Start are provided with a packet of information about the Head Start program, including a copy of the parent handbook. In addition, parents also attended orientation, open house, parent conferences, and home visits. Families were given the opportunity to visit the classrooms, meet administrators, the family engagement specialists, and other staff involved with the students to ask questions about the program and curriculum. The Head Start program is the beginning for many students on their journey to Kindergarten Readiness.

AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTAL RESOLUTION

A RESOLUTION AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING THE AUGUST 10, 2021 RESOLUTION OF THE CALCASIEU PARISH SCHOOL BOARD AUTHORIZING DEVELOPMENT OF REFUNDING OF CERTAIN OUTSTANDING BONDS OF SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 21; AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE BY SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 21 OF NOT EXCEEDING \$3,400,000 GENERAL OBLIGATION REFUNDING BONDS; MAKING APPLICATION TO THE STATE BOND COMMISSION AND PROVIDING FOR OTHER MATTERS IN CONNECTION THEREWITH.

WHEREAS, the Calcasieu Parish School Board, acting as the governing authority of School District No. 21 of Calcasieu Parish, Louisiana (the “*Issuer*”), after examining available data, has determined that there is substantial need within the Issuer for refunding certain outstanding maturities of the Issuer’s \$6,220,000 General Obligation Refunding Bonds, 2012 Series, dated February 15, 2012 on original issue (the “*Refunded Bonds*”), in accordance with the provisions of Sections 505 and 531 of Title 39 and Chapter 14-A of Title 39 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, as amended; and

WHEREAS, issuance of certain general obligation refunding bonds of the Issuer will assist in alleviating such need;

WHEREAS, this Amending and Supplemental Resolution amends and supplements the Issuer’s August 10, 2021 Resolution permitting and authorizing a refunding of the Refunded Bonds on either a taxable and/or tax-exempt basis, in a manner most beneficial to the Issuer;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Calcasieu Parish School Board, the governing authority of School District No. 21 of Calcasieu Parish, Louisiana, as follows:

SECTION 1. The statements of fact expressly contained within the preamble to this Resolution have been specifically reviewed by the Issuer’s School Board Members and are found to be factually true and correct and are made resolutions of the Issuer.

SECTION 2. The Issuer is hereby authorized to proceed with refunding a portion or all outstanding maturities of the Issuer’s Refunded Bonds, consisting of those bonds maturing July 15, 2023 through July 15, 2028, involving the proposed issuance by the Issuer of not exceeding \$3,400,000 General Obligation Refunding Bonds, Series 2022, to mature not later than July 15, 2028, at an interest

rate or rates not exceeding 5.00% per annum, on a taxable and/or tax-exempt basis, in a manner most beneficial to the Issuer.

SECTION 3. Application is hereby formally made to the Louisiana State Bond Commission, pursuant to the provisions of Subpart A of Part II, Chapter 4 of Subtitle II of Title 39 and Chapter 14-A of Title 39 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, as amended (La. R.S. 39:501 et seq.), for consent, approval and authority to issue, sell and deliver the bonds herein authorized, to be secured by and payable from the levy and collection of unlimited annual ad valorem taxes on all taxable property within the limits of the Issuer.

By virtue of the Issuer's application for, acceptance and utilization of the benefits of the Louisiana State Bond Commission's approval(s) resolved and set forth herein, it resolves that it understands and agrees that such approval(s) are expressly conditioned upon, and it further resolves that it understands, agrees and binds itself, its successors and assigns to, full and continuing compliance with the "State Bond Commission Policy on Approval of Proposed Use of Swaps, or other forms of Derivative Products Hedges, Etc.," adopted by the Commission on July 20, 2006, as to the borrowing(s) and other matter(s) subject to the approval(s), including subsequent application and approval under said Policy of the implementation or use of any swap(s) or other product(s) or enhancement(s) covered thereby.

SECTION 4. The Secretary is empowered, authorized and requested to forward to the Louisiana State Bond Commission a certified copy of this resolution which shall constitute a formal application as herein provided.

SECTION 5. There being a real public necessity for the retention and employment of legal counsel to provide specialized legal services in connection with issuance of the Bonds by the Issuer, and it appearing that the public interest requires obtaining of such specialized legal services, Joseph A. Delafield, A Professional Corporation, of Lake Charles, Louisiana ("**Bond Counsel**"), is hereby employed for such purposes. The fee for the work to be performed by Bond Counsel is contingent upon the issuance, sale and delivery of the Bonds, and shall be in accordance with the maximum fee schedule of the Attorney General of the State of Louisiana for comprehensive legal and coordinate professional work of bond attorneys and bond counsel in the issuance of general obligation bonds.

SECTION 6. The employment of Crews & Associates, Inc., as Underwriter or Placement Agent in connection with the Bonds is hereby approved. The compensation of the Underwriter shall be payable from the proceeds of the Bonds and shall be subject to the approval of the Issuer and the Louisiana State Bond Commission.

SECTION 7. The employment of Government Consultants, Inc., Baton Rouge, Louisiana, as Municipal Advisor in connection with the Bonds is hereby approved. The compensation of the Municipal Advisor shall be payable from the proceeds of the Bonds and shall be subject to the approval of the Board and the Louisiana State Bond Commission.

SECTION 8. A copy of this Resolution shall be published immediately after its adoption in one (1) issue of the official journal of the Issuer. For a period of thirty (30) days from the date of such publication, any person in interest shall have the right to contest the legality of this Resolution and of the Bonds to be issued pursuant hereto and the provisions hereof securing the Bonds. After the expiration of said thirty (30) days, no one shall have any right of action to contest the validity of the Bonds or the provisions of this Resolution, and the Bonds shall be conclusively presumed to be legal and no court shall thereafter have authority to inquire into such matters.

WHEREAS, on December 11, 2021, an election was held in Sales Tax District No. Two of Calcasieu Parish, Louisiana, to determine the proposition hereinafter set out;

WHEREAS, the returns of said election were canvassed by the Calcasieu Parish School Board, governing authority of Sales Tax District No. Two, according to law and notice duly given as provided by law, and the result of said election was declared to be in favor of the proposition;

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SALES AND USE TAX ORDINANCE

An Ordinance providing for the renewal of the levy and collection of a one-half of one percent ($\frac{1}{2}$ of 1%) sales and use tax ("Tax") by Sales Tax District No. Two of Calcasieu Parish, Louisiana ("District"), for an additional 10-year period beginning January 1, 2023, in accordance with the provisions and terms of Chapter 2D of Subtitle II, Title 47 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, as it may be amended ("Uniform Local Sales Tax Code").

WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions of Section 338.54 of Title 47 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, as amended (a redesignation of La. R.S. 33:2721.6 pursuant to Act 248 of the 2011 Legislative Session), and Article VI, Section 29 of the Louisiana Constitution of 1974, and the authority granted at a special election held within Sales Tax District No. Two of Calcasieu Parish, Louisiana ("District"), on December 11, 2021, the District now renews the levy and collection of the Tax for an additional 10-year period beginning January 1, 2023, the proceeds of which are to be allocated, distributed, and used by the District as set forth in the proposition submitted at the election, a copy of which proposition is attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and made a part of this ordinance as if fully set forth herein;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE SCHOOL BOARD OF CALCASIEU PARISH, LOUISIANA, GOVERNING AUTHORITY OF SALES TAX DISTRICT NO. TWO OF CALCASIEU PARISH, LOUISIANA (the "School Board"), that:

SECTION 1. Acceptance of Preamble and Whereas Clauses. The statements of fact expressly contained within the preamble to this Resolution have been specifically reviewed by the District's School Board members and are found to be factually true and correct and are made resolutions of the District.

SECTION 2. District Tax. The renewal of the Tax in favor of the District authorized at a special election held within the Parish, on December 11, 2021, upon the sale at retail, the use, the lease or rental, the consumption, the distribution and storage for use or consumption, of tangible personal property, and upon the sale of services in the Parish, shall continue to be assessed, imposed, collected, paid and enforced, in the manner and subject to the terms and provisions of Uniform Local Sales Tax Code, the provisions of which are incorporated by reference herein.

Proceeds of the Tax, described in this section shall continue to be allocated, distributed and used by the School Board in the manner and for the purposes described and provided for in Exhibit "A" hereto which is the proposition approved by the electorate of the Parish at an election held December 11, 2021.

SECTION 3. Integrated Bracket Schedule Applicable to Collection. The Tax described in Section 2 shall be collected on the basis of the applicable integrated bracket schedule prescribed by the Collector of Revenue, State of Louisiana, pursuant to Section 304 of Title 47 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, as amended (R.S. 47:304). The dealers shall remit to the sales tax collector of the School Board ("Collector") and comply with the Uniform Local Sales Tax Code, particularly La. R. S. 47:337.29, the proportionate part of the sales and use taxes collected in the Parish in accordance with said integrated bracket schedule.

SECTION 4. Vendor's Compensation. For the purpose of compensating the dealer in accounting for and remitting the Tax described in this Ordinance, each dealer shall be allowed one percent (1%) of the amount of the Tax due and accounted for and remitted to the Collector in the form of a deduction in submitting his report and/or reports and paying the amount due by the dealer, provided the amount due was not delinquent at the time of payment, and provided the amount of any credit claimed for taxes already paid to a wholesaler shall not be deducted in computing the commission allowed the dealer hereunder.

SECTION 5. Exclusions and Exemptions. The Tax imposed under this Ordinance is subject to specific provisions under La. R.S. 47:305 of the Louisiana State sales and use tax laws and La. R.S. 47:337.9 of the Uniform Local Sales Tax Code. The School Board has not adopted the optional exclusions or exemptions allowed by Louisiana State sales and use tax law and codified under R.S. 47:337.10, nor shall it adopt any exclusions or exemptions which are not allowed as an exclusion or exemption from Louisiana State sales and use tax. Included within the tax base is every transaction, whether sales, use, lease or rental, or service, with no exclusions or exemptions except for those mandated upon political subdivisions by the Constitution or statutes of the State of Louisiana.

SECTION 6. Interest. The interest on the unpaid Tax provided for by La. R.S. 47:337.69 shall be at the rate of one and one-fourth percent (1-1/4%) per month.

SECTION 7. Delinquency Penalty. Penalty on the unpaid Tax as provided by La. R. S. 47:337.70 shall be five percent (5%) per month.

SECTION 8. Penalty for False or Fraudulent Return. Penalty as provided by La. R.S. 47:337.72 shall be fifty percent (50%) of the Tax found to be due.

SECTION 9. Negligence Penalty. The penalty provided by La. R.S. 47:337.73 shall be five percent (5%) of the Tax or deficiencies found to be due, or ten dollars (\$10.00), whichever is greater.

SECTION 10. Penalty for Insufficient Funds Check. The penalty provided in La. R.S. 47:337.74 shall be an amount equal to the greater of one percent (1%) of the check or twenty dollars (\$20.00).

SECTION 11. Attorney Fees. The Collector is authorized to employ private counsel to assist in the collection of any Tax, penalties or interest due under this Ordinance, or to represent him in any proceeding under this Ordinance. If any Tax, penalties or interest due under this Ordinance are referred to an attorney at law for collection, an additional charge of attorney fees, in the amount of ten percent (10%) of the Tax, penalties and interest due, shall be paid by the tax debtor. Additional provisions applicable to attorney fees, inclusive of prevailing party and waiver of such fees, are included under La. R.S. 47:337.13.1 of the Uniform Local Sales Tax Code.

SECTION 12. Limits on Interest, Penalty and Attorney Fees. Should the interest, penalties or attorney fees herein, or the combined interest, penalties and attorney fees be declared to be in excess of limits provided by other law, including relevant jurisprudence, then the maximum interest, penalties and attorney fees allowed by such other law shall apply.

SECTION 13. Collector. All sales and use taxes described in this ordinance shall be collected by a "Collector" as provided by La. R.S. 47:301.(2)(b) which shall mean and include the School Board Sales and Use Tax Department, the entity presently collecting sales and use taxes on behalf of the District.

SECTION 14. Powers of Collector. The Collector is hereby authorized, empowered and directed to carry into effect the provisions of this Ordinance, to appoint deputies, assistants or agents to assist in the performance of his duties, and in pursuance thereof to make and enforce such rules as he may deem necessary.

SECTION 15. Disposition of Revenues. All Tax, revenues, funds, assessments,

monies, penalties, fees or other income which may be collected or come into the possession of the Collector under any provision or provisions of this Ordinance relating to the Tax described herein shall be promptly deposited by the Collector for the account of the District, provided, however, any amount which is paid under protest or which is subject to litigation may be transferred to a separate account established by the Collector with said fiscal agent pending the final determination of the protest or litigation.

Out of the funds on deposit in such special funds, the Collector shall first pay all reasonable and necessary costs and expenses of administering and collecting the Tax described herein and administering the provisions of this Ordinance, as well as the various administrative and enforcement procedures. Such costs and expenses shall be reported by the Collector monthly to the District.

In compliance with the special election authorizing the renewal of the levy and collection of the Tax described herein, after all reasonable and necessary costs and expenses of collecting and administration of the Tax have been paid as provided for above, the remaining balance in such special funds shall be available for appropriation and expenditure by the District solely for the purposes designated in the proposition authorizing the levy of the Tax.

SECTION 16. Accounting for Funds. All funds or accounts described herein may be separate funds or accounts or may be a separate accounting with a general or “sweep” fund or account containing monies from multiple sources so long as separate accounting of such monies is maintained.

SECTION 17. Severability. If any one or more of the provisions of this Ordinance shall for any reason be held to be illegal or invalid, such illegality or invalidity shall not affect any other provision of this Ordinance, but this Ordinance shall be construed and enforced as if such illegal or invalid provisions had not been contained herein. Any constitutional or statutory provision enacted after the date of this Ordinance which validates or makes legal any provision of this Ordinance which would not otherwise be valid or legal, shall be deemed to apply to this Ordinance.

SECTION 18. Uniform Local Sales Tax Code is Controlling. If any provision of this Ordinance shall be in conflict with the provisions of the Uniform Local Sales Tax Code, the provisions of the Uniform Local Sales Tax Code shall be controlling.

SECTION 19. Effect Upon Prior Sales Tax Ordinances. With respect to the District Tax, this Ordinance shall be considered as additional and supplemental to the ordinances heretofore adopted by the District, to provide that the Tax now authorized to be levied in the District shall hereinafter be collected, administered and enforced in the manner provided by the Uniform Local Sales

Tax Code and shall not be construed to rescind and repeal any prior resolutions or ordinances of the District relating to the levy, allocation, distribution and use of the proceeds of the Tax.

SECTION 20. Effective Date. The renewal of the Tax shall be effective on January 1, 2023.

SECTION 21. Term. The Tax shall remain in effect for ten (10) years (January 1, 2023, through December 31, 2032).

SECTION 22. Publication and Recordation. A copy of this Ordinance shall be duly published in the *American Press*, the official journal of the Calcasieu Parish School Board, as soon as is reasonably possible. A certified copy of this Ordinance shall be recorded in the mortgage records of Calcasieu Parish.
