












BIG RIG DAY

HIGH SCHOOL ADDITIVE MANUFACTURING COMPETITION



Oregon Manufacturing Innovation Center Research & Development (OMIC) hosted its first Annual Additive Manufacturing Competition! In Partnership with The American Center of Manufacturing and Innovation (ACMI), OMIC R&D invited four high school teams (Glencoe High School, Scappoose High School, St. Helens High School, and Beaverton Academy of Science and Learning) to compete in designing a machine that could effectively hurl a golf ball inside its new Additive Manufacturing Center. Each team was supplied with a 3-D printer by OMIC R&D, given four weeks, and challenged in the following categories:

- Design
- ·Execution
- ·Accuracy
- ·Distance
