













CURRICULUM ADOPTION



The St. Helens School District is finalizing its Curriculum Resource Adoption for English Language Development and Math adoption materials.


The process begins with teachers applying to be on the teams to begin the adoption work. A wide variety of teachers are selected to represent all schools and grade levels.

Once the teacher experts are assembled, they review the state standards that drive instruction so they can select materials that best fit our community while aligning with state requirements.

The next step in the process is for the team to review best teaching practices and then share those practices with their schools.

Finally, the teams from both the English Language Development Team and the Math Team review the materials with staff input and make final recommendations to the School Board for review and to hear any community comments. Although no adoption is perfect, the English Language Development Curriculum Resource Adoption Team and the Math Team believe these are the best resources available to help students meet state standards.
