The proposed Bond, if passed, would raise \$4 Million and if passed would fund the completion of these projects at St.

Helens High School.

- Update and replace HVAC in gyms
- Upgrade the construction and automotive programs
- New covered lunch/courtyard area
- Pave the parking lot
- Update the auditorium
- · Install synthetic turf at the softball and baseball fields

How Much Would it Cost?

The proposed measure would authorize a continuation of the current tax rate. If passed, the proposed measure would raise approximately \$4 million based on a tax rate of approximately \$2.28 per \$1,000 of assessed property value.

State Matching Grant: If the proposed bond is passed, the school district would receive an estimated \$4 Million in state matching funds to fund the completion of projects at St. Helens High School.

If the measure does not pass, the projects would not be completed as proposed and the current tax rate of \$2.21 per \$1000 of assessed property value and would expire in June 2050.


