


















St. Helens High School Renovation & Remodeling students tour the Timberlab facility and watch as the beams for their job site house are being milled.



FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS ABOUT THE PROPOSED BOND

Where can we see an exact statement of what the Proposed St. Helens School District Bond money will be spent on? There is language in the document that states "including" the projects you have mentioned but does not explain what the money will be allocated to in the entirety.



- Architects and Engineers cover all drawings and engineering required for the structure.
- Professional Services include items such as Geotech
 Engineering, Traffic Engineering, Land Use Consultant,

 Wetland Investigation, and other consulting services.
- Construction is where the majority of the money is budgeted for the actual building of the school structures, sports fields, and parking lots.
- Hazardous Materials are for abatement which is primarily asbestos, common in older building's drywall and floor tiles.
- Furniture and Equipment pay for desks, science equipment, and supplies, as well as new technologies like smart boards.
- A majority of the Permits budget goes to paying for building permits to the city.
