The St. Helens School District would like to thank InRoads Credit Union, students, staff, and community members who joined this program for their continued support of St. Helens High School.









Through her leadership, Columbia Health Services has become the go-to health provider in Columbia County. Sherrie Ford is also very active in the ConnectSH work to build a stronger community where everyone feels belonging. She currently has multiple grant applications out and awaiting approval for potentially millions of more dollars to support our students and community.

Sherrie is a passionate advocate for our schools and community, leading the way to support student health and wellness, community development, and risk prevention. She is proud of the fact that she is able to serve a community that raised her and that Columbia Health Services employs a local workforce of people dedicated to our community as much as she is.
