

How are students grouped?

Groups of 8-10 freshmen are randomly assigned to 2 carefully selected 11th or 12th grade Link Crew leaders.

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

- Students must remain on campus by the cafeteria after 3:45 p.m. if waiting for a ride home. You CANNOT stand in front of the school on the corner of Broadway and Hawthorne.
- Campus closes at 4:30 p.m.

ATTENDANCE



- Daily attendance in school is compulsory for all assigned classes.
- If a student must be absent, please notify the school in advance.
- When the student returns to school, he or she must have a note explaining his/her absence signed by the parent.
- If a student is absent due to an unexpected illness or emergency, parent or guardian should notify the school by 10 a.m.

Attendance, cont.



- The only reasons for absences that are considered EXCUSED are:
 - Personal illness (note from parent accepted for up to 2 consecutive days)
 - Emergency medical, dental, and optometry appointments (note from doctor)
 - Serious family emergencies (subject to administrative approval)
 - Death of an immediate family member.
- All other reasons for absences are considered UNEXCUSED.

Attendance, cont.



- Any planned absences (for any of the above reasons) for more than 3 consecutive days require Administration approval for a student to make up work.
- When a student returns from an absence, he/she must bring a note from the parent, doctor, or court explaining the absence.
- If a student does not bring a note, he/she will be marked as unexcused and may be assigned detention.
- Students with unexcused absences for more than one week will have a parent conference scheduled.

TARDY POLICY

4.5 Tardy Policy



- Each student is responsible for being on time to school.
- A student who is tardy to school will be marked with an UNEXCUSED tardy.
- For every tardy to school, students will be assigned Lunch Detention.
- A parent's note will excuse the student from that day's Lunch detention, but does not excuse the tardy itself.
- A parental note cannot be used more than 3 times in a school year.

Log Entries- a way to maintain contact with parents about student preparation and performance. We want you to be informed so that you can address the matter before time passes.

Student reports to office to make log entry call for one of the following reasons:

- Incomplete or no homework
- Missing school materials
- Failed quizzes and tests
- Dress Code
- PE preparedness and performance

- ✓ 9th graders report to support staff on schedule
- ✓ 10th-12th graders report to Security Officer Office

Students are expected to wait quietly in line. If they are talking in line, please ask them to add a new log entry for talking in log entry line and send them down to AP office for discipline. Please alert AP through radio to expect student.

Student(s) sent for a log entry due to disruptive classroom behavior should be sent to AP office. Please alert AP through radio to expect student(s).

Student Log Entry Call Process:

- Student hands over school planner/agenda turned to log entry page to staff.
- Student dials number without picking up receiver, leaving the phone on speaker.
- Staff confirms that dialed number belongs to parent.
- Once parent or voicemail picks up, student picks up receiver and states reason for log entry.
- Staff signs log entry sheet and records time student left office.
- Student returns to class.


1. Teachers / Admin / Staff will send students to Mr. Cifuentes with a log entry request in planner. *Must be filled prior to arrival.

The district expects all students to use technology responsibly. The district may place reasonable restrictions on the sites, material, and information that students may access through the system.

Your signature on this document (whether provided electronically or on hard copy) is your binding promise to be responsible and safe and to follow this Acceptable Use Agreement. Inappropriate use of district technology resources may result in the cancellation of user privileges, disciplinary and/or legal action. Activities that violate state, local or federal law may be subject to prosecution. All users are bound by future updates of this Agreement.

Definitions




