Attendance Matters

Impact on Academics

- School attendance is the most powerful predictor of student outcomes
- Compared to their peers who graduate, students who fail to complete their high school education are more likely to live in poverty, suffer poor health, and become involved in the criminal justice system
- When students are not present they cannot learn
- Poor attendance has a negative impact on social and emotional development

Attendance Need-to-Knows

District Overview

- Attendance is a concern across the district
- Having your student in the building everyday is key to their success



Need to knows

- Excuses should be submitted to attendance office within 5 days of the student returning to school
- Students are responsible for making up any assignments missed
- Parents of students with excessive absences will be notified.

Attendance Support Team

Work Based Learning

- Provides 11th and 12th grade students the opportunity to leave campus to earn money and gain valuable experience
- Job and CTAE coursework should align
- 1 period= 5 hours of work per week
- 2 periods= 10 hours/week
- 3 periods= 15 hours/week

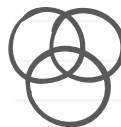

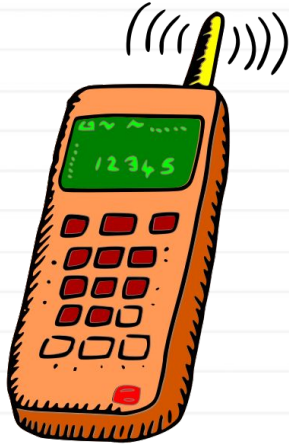


Students have access to a restroom at all times throughout the day

Food Delivery Policy Statesboro High School 2023-2024

- **Students are not permitted to order food to be delivered during the school day. This includes but is not limited to Door Dash, Grub Hub, or any other food delivery service.**
- **School deliveries from outside resources are considered a Student Safety Risk.**
- **Deliveries made to the school by delivery persons of any type are not permitted and will be turned away.**
- **Only approved persons in Infinite Campus will be permitted to drop food off.**
- **One meal per student.**
- **Students pick up their lunch from front office during their designated lunch period or picked up after school.**

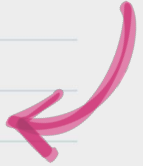

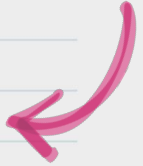

Cameras

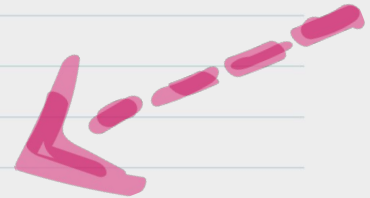
