Last month, Student Services celebrated the incredible work of our school counselors – Ms. Pucci, Ms. Knor, and Dr. O'Reilly – during National School Counseling Week, February 6 – 10! School Counselors play a critical role in students' success by collaborating with students, families, teachers, administrators, and other professionals to provide individualized social-emotional, career, and academic support to students. The average caseload for a school counselor in the United States is 408 students for every 1 counselor (*ASCA*, *2023*). In Josephinum's Student Services Department, we are able to maintain a ratio of 28 students to every 1 professional! The Josephinum community is fortunate to have such gifted, devoted, and exceptional professionals helping our students dream big!


LIVE FROM THE HEART

day! By consuming carbohydrates in the morning you are replenishing your body's supply of glucose which boosts your energy levels and alertness, leading to better school achievements!






