National Honor Society*

The National Honor Society is a nationwide organization for high school students. Whitesburg Christian Academy's Chapter of the National Honor Society (NHS) is an elite academic society that selects students based on four criteria: scholarship, leadership, service, and character. NHS is open to eligible sophomores, juniors, and seniors. Initial eligibility is based on a student's 3.25 cumulative core GPA, but securing membership is a two-step process. Eligible students are invited to apply for NHS membership through the submission of a new member application packet, a resume, an essay, and two teacher recommendations. Once all documentation is submitted, a council of faculty members reviews all submissions and selects the most qualified students for NHS membership.

Selected students can expect to meet once a month, complete individual service hours, and participate in group service projects.

In addition, there are opportunities to serve in leadership positions. The Academy's NHS Chapter is headed by a president, a vice president, a secretary, and a treasurer and leadership positions are voted on each year. Science Olympiad is one of the premiere science competitions in the nation, providing standards-based challenges to nearly 8,000

teams in all 50 states. Science Olympiad competitions are like academic track meets, consisting of a series of 23 team events in each division. Each year, a portion of the events are rotated to reflect the ever-changing nature of genetics, earth science, chemistry, anatomy, physics, geology, mechanical engineering and technology. By combining events from all disciplines, Science Olympiad encourages a wide cross-section of students to get involved.

Each team will consist of 15 members 9-12th grades. We will begin preparation in the late fall and compete in the regional tournament (probably at UAH) in the Feb/Mar and if we do well we will compete at the state meet in Auburn in April. Nationals are held in the summer for state champions only. Sign up will be in November.
