I am writing to inform you about an important update regarding the Advanced Placement (AP) Psychology course at Flagler Palm Coast High School.

Due to recent changes and the evolving educational landscape, Flagler Schools has made the decision to transition from offering AP Psychology to now offering International Baccalaureate (IB) Psychology for the 2023-2024 school year. This decision was made after careful consideration of prior coursework related to the study of Psychology completed by currently enrolled students. While AP Psychology is currently still offered in Florida, we want to ensure that students have the opportunity to take the college-level Psychology course and exam for articulated credit, so Flagler Schools have opted to offer IB Psychology.

As a result, all students who previously registered for AP Psychology will now be automatically moved and enrolled in the IB Psychology SL (standard level) course. We believe that this transition will provide our students with a comprehensive and internationally recognized educational experience, equipping them with valuable skills and knowledge to succeed in their future academic pursuits.

The IB Psychology course, like the AP Psychology course, is of college-level rigor, and offers the opportunity to earn college credit to students who meet the requirements and pass the exam at the end of the year. The key difference between the two courses is that in IB Psychology SL, students conduct an internal assessment (IA) in the form of an experimental study. This IA is part of the overall exam score. The IB exam consists of two timed "papers" or written responses. AP Psychology's exam is a mixture of multiple choice and timed written responses.

We understand that this change may raise questions or concerns among students and parents. Therefore, we want to assure you that there will be an opportunity to discuss options and address any inquiries you may have.
