Introductions:

Myel Jenkins, C&S Committee Chair, started the meeting off with an introduction of all committee members and called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m.

NEW BUSINESS:

Career Technical Education (CTE):

Brett Wolfe, Director, CTE, K-12 Counseling and College and Career Readiness shared his presentation on CTE. Mr. Wolfe shared the overview of CTE, San Juan has 11 sectors and 20 different pathways. The goal of CTE is to give students a “jumping-off point” to a career after they complete the program. Mr. Wolfe shared how as enrollment in the district has decreased, the CTE enrollment has increased year to year, and the programs offered are increasing as well.

Mr. Wolfe shared that teacher recruitment and training are different at the district level. You do not need to have a teaching credential to teach CTE courses, you can be from the industry to teach certain courses but must obtain a teaching credential. San Juan works with Yolo County, and the Department of Education to help teachers get a temporary credential while they take courses to obtain a teaching credential. He also shared how students get work-based learning by doing internships or having simulated coursework done in class. We offer culinary arts, fire technicians, automotive technology, broadcast and video production, and medical and dental assisting just to name a few.

CTE also works with community partners as well as each pathway has an advisory team at the district level that works with the students and program. The programs have guest speakers and can go into the community to firehouses and do a ride along on the fire trucks with Sacramento Metro Fire Department. The new pathways that are coming to our schools are Construction and Transportation/Aviation.

Transportation/Aviation has a partnership with the Aerospace Museum at McClellan Park and the students will learn to fly drones, use simulators, and aviation mechanics.

The committee and Mr. Wolfe had a discussion on many topics including that you can attend a CTE course at one school if you attend a different school within the district. The committee also wanted to know if the CTE course fall under the A-G requirements for graduation. Mr. Wolfe let the committee that they do fall under the A-G requirement. Another committee member would like to see Performing Arts come to the CTE pathway.
