ROBERTO DELIVERS 2023 STATE OF THE SCHOOLS ADDRESS



The Aurora City School District's Superintendent, Mike Roberto, presented his State of the Schools' address during the City of Aurora's State of the City luncheon on March 15, 2023. This year's annual luncheon was held at the Bertram Inn & Conference Center. Roberto explained that, "This year I will be completing my third year as superintendent of the schools, but it is the first out from under the cloud of the pandemic."

Roberto shared that it has been a little over a year since he introduced the district's new strategic vision, which can be found on the district website, saying that it focuses on the district mantra, Aurora Learners – Future Ready.

Roberto went on to explain that, "Starting with the 2021-2022 school year and moving forward school districts in Ohio are being rated on a 5-star scale with 3 stars meaning a district is meeting state requirements and 4 or 5 stars meaning the district exceeds or significantly exceeds the state expectations for particular components (Achievement, Progress, Gap Closing, Graduation Rate, Early Literacy) as measured by the Ohio Department of Education. The ACSD was one of only twelve districts out of over 600 in Ohio to earn 5 stars" He added, "Our goal as educators is not to raise test scores, but to help raise human beings. That is the narrative we would like you to take away from this report card...a narrative of Aurora Learners who are Future Ready."

While Roberto feels that the Aurora community is supportive of the district narrative, he added, "to be honest I believe folks outside the district recognize the value of Aurora Schools as well. Aurora seems to be a popular place lately..." which led to his update on the district's potential new construction need. Roberto went on to explain, "The need to look into potential new construction is two-fold. The first is a side effect of a strong state report card and a near perfect Special Education Profile. That is to say, young families want to bring their children to Aurora because of the strong school system. The second is centered around the fact that there is now more available housing for families to move into the district. Expansions in existing developments, such as Hawthorn, along

with several additional new developments throughout the city, have made Aurora a destination district for families with children. As an example, since the end of May, we have had over 55 new students move into the district. It appears to be the beginning of enrollment growth similar to the late 1990s which led to the construction of Leighton Intermediate School in 2001." The search for potential new construction began in March 2023 and resulted in the Aurora BOE approving the ThenDesign Architectural (TDA) firm based in Willoughby to take the lead on researching the potential construction research. The district then held staff/community open houses to gather resident feedback in the spring. Roberto said, "Although we are in the early stages of a long process, we are excited for the journey. Over the next year we, along with TDA, will be holding meetings and completing research to determine if the community is willing to support construction of a new school and if so, what type of school would best fit within the district."

Roberto also voiced concerns about two concerns coming from legislation in Columbus. One is Ohio Governor De Wine's intention to expand the EdChoice Program which increases the income eligibility threshold from 250% TO 400% of the federal poverty level to qualify students for the income-based version of the EdChoice program. The second is the SB11 is titled the "Parent Education Freedom Act" but is labeled the "Backpack Bill" by many because it allows public school dollars to be carried away to non-public schools. This is a concern to public schools because funding for school vouchers comes from the same line-item in the state budget which funds public schools.



AHS Principal, **Mike Hayes**, and AHS students, **Charlie Carpenter, Allie DeSapri, Vikas Duvvuri, Payton Griffith**, and **Dmirty Volf**, were special guests at the City of Aurora's State of the City luncheon in February. This event allowed them to get a glimpse of local government and valuable insight into Aurora's progress and future plans.

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Roberto concluded with, "Now despite these concerns, the faculty and staff of the Aurora Schools continue to provide a first class education opportunity with a focus on our commitment to putting kids first by providing them with a safe nurturing learning environment. We are deeply committed to protecting and promoting the strengths of Aurora; and undoubtedly one of them is the Aurora Schools. I'm honored to lead this wonderful school system in such a great community and we appreciate the amazing support you give to our district. It is truly a fantastic time to be an Aurora Greenmen."

AHS EARNS SECOND PURPLE STAR DESIGNATION

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Congratulations are in store once again for Aurora High School (AHS) for earning another Purple Star Award from the Ohio Department of

Education's Purple Star Advisory Board. This is the second consecutive time AHS has earned this award. When awarded with the Purple Star Award, schools receive the recognition that lasts for three years. The Purple Star Award is given to military friendly schools who have shown a major commitment to students and families in the military. In order to earn this honor, a school must have a trained school liaison who is required to complete a rigorous application process which includes providing all of the requirements needed to earn the award. School district requirements include, supplying resources on the district website, providing a process to connect with military families and supporting various military related school activities. Several military examples of activities sponsored by AHS include, the Veterans Day Dinner/Celebration and the Hoodies for Heroes Fundraiser. Counselor Kalee Oberlin is once again the ACSD military family liaison. Superintendent, Mike Roberto, said of the honor, "Receiving this recognition is a testament to Aurora's community-values as well as the extensive efforts staff and stakeholders have gone to hosting events like the Veterans' Day Luncheon and Hoodies for Heroes Fundraiser supporting our country's military and their families."


WELCOME BACK GRANDPARENT TEA
