What is SEAC?

Greene County Schools Special Education Advisory Committee (SEAC) works with the school board, administrators, parents and teachers who are responsible for students receiving special education services.

What are the functions of SEAC?

- *Advise the school division of needs in the education of children with disabilities
- *Participate in the development of priorities and strategies for meeting the needs of children with disabilities
- *Submit periodic reports and recommendations regarding the education of students with disabilities
- *Assist GCPS in interpreting plans to the community for meeting the special needs of children with disabilities for educational services
- *Review policies and procedures for the provision of special education and related services prior to submission to the local school board
- *Participate in the review of the local school division's annual plan



Who may attend?

SEAC meetings are open to the public. Anyone may attend.

Who serves on the committee?

Parents of students with disabilities or individuals with disabilities, educators, community organizations, and a representative from the Office of Special Services.
