



Children must be five-years-old by Aug. 31, 2023 to enroll in kindergarten for the 2023-24 school year. To enroll your child, please bring an official copy of their birth certificate, proof of immunization, and proof of residence in Lake Stevens School District. Enrollment is limited to those students who live within district boundaries.

The first day of school for kindergarten for the 2023-24 school year is Monday, Sept. 11.
