will see us through many days ahead.






# School News






St. James' own Elizabeth Phelps is coming for a visit, and will be talking about her book, *Unlocking the Headache Mystery, Essential Keys to Reclaim Your Vibrant Life* at the Fairhope Library Sept. 30 at 1:00 p.m. This book was written while Elizabeth was living in Fairhope and working at St. James, so it's truly part of our own community. She is thrilled to finally be able to share the information with us, and can't wait to see everyone!

The book brings science, methods, and new perspectives to readers in accessible, friendly language, and describes Elizabeth's personal journey to find solutions. From experiences with the giants of headache research--Diamond Headache Clinic, The Cleveland Clinic, iconoclast Dr. David Buchholz of Johns Hopkins Medical—Elizabeth walks you through therapeutic and alternative solutions. Each topic is brought to life with her personal stories, including how her own experience with suffering led her to realize a spiritual gift of hands-on removal of headaches from others. The content applies to a range of chronic miseries. "It's not just about headaches. The information pertains to healing chronic emotional and physical pain in general. For me, healing requires a spiritual walk through the woods while tending to basic healing protocols."

Concert organist Nathaniel Gumbs has performed at many venues in the U.S.A. and abroad. He is Director of Chapel Music at Yale University where he coordinates music for three worshiping communities: the University Church in Battell Chapel, and at Yale Divinity School in both Marquand Chapel and Berkeley Divinity School. In 2017 The Diapason magazine recognized Nathaniel as one of 20 outstanding organists under 30 years old for his achievement in organ performance and church music.
