

After two years, the Charles Little Auditorium welcomed its first audiences since the lockdown. The LCS Fine Arts Department was thrilled to invite their community back for a three-part concert series, including public sharings from groups in 4th through 12th grade.

The first concert was a night with the Senior High Chorus and Senior High Band. Mrs. Raymond took the stage for her second concert series at LCS as the director of choirs. Mr. Wartinger took the stage for his final performance as the leader of the Senior High Band. Both groups had a varied selection of repertoire including holiday selections. Spectrum and Jazz Band provided musical contributions to the program.

The second night in the concert lineup was Junior High music featuring both the Junior High Chorus and Junior High Band. A massive 80-plus chorus led by Mrs. Raymond sang their prepared pieces and shared a video of music created for the event. Mr. Decker led the Junior Band in a strong performance of musicians who had not touched their instruments since before the lockdown a year and a half ago.

The final concert was a night of new beginnings. Two beginning choruses and two beginning bands took the stage for the very first time. The 6th grade chorus was the only group with one concert experience on this program. Mr. Hopkins led his 4th Grade Chorus to a grand performance of the holiday fair.
