Purpose of Position: Under the direction of the ??, the Program Specialist, Visual and Performing Arts (VAPA) will be responsible for leading the District's visual and performing arts programming, administering the budget of VAPA, and articulation throughout TK-12 VAPA.

Essential Functions:

- Provide leadership that delivers on the unique needs of a socio-economically, culturally, ethnically, racially and linguistically diverse student population.
- Work with district and site level teams to develop articulated strategies and plans to address the need for visual and performing arts programs to ensure equitable access and outcomes so all students can have a robust VAPA experience across TK-12.
- Coordinate with site administrators on VAPA plans and programming TK-12.
- Ensure that fiscal resources are utilized in a way that addresses the needs of our most vulnerable learners, where actions and expenditures are supported by student access to VAPA programming.
- Coordinates the implementation of the Board-adopted TK-12 Strategic Arts Plan.
- Provides leadership in the implementation of high quality, standards-based art instruction.
- Coordinates available student-centered data to identify and design strategies to address areas of need in arts instruction TK-12.
- Collaborates with VAPA leads TK-12 to facilitate the design and development of professional learning
- Align leadership, revenue and resources to support the District's VAPA priorities, including monitoring compliance to aid district and site staff in developing and strengthening Arts programs
- Ensure VAPA programs address the needs of our most vulnerable learners, where actions and expenditures are supported by student outcome data.
- Develop and coordinate cycles of inquiry and data analysis that evaluate program outcomes for all students, particularly socio-economically, culturally, ethnically, racially and linguistically diverse populations
- Assist in recruiting and assigning VAPA staff to support the achievement of all students, in particular a
 heightened level of focus on socio-economically, culturally, ethnically, racially and linguistically diverse
 student populations
- Assist with the development, recruitment, and maintenance of the VAPA Steering Committee to establish, update and sustain the Strategic Arts Plan.

- Develop partnerships with the community so students can benefit from the community partners' rich cultural and artistic resources.
- Build capacity with staff, families, and community stakeholders to celebrate and sustain the diverse student populations we serve.
- Establish opportunities for all students to develop their voice, agency, and leadership in ways that respect and affirm their multiple identities.
- Integrate the at-promise students into VAPA programs.
- Organize, develop, and execute plans for VAPA professional development for teachers, and other staff that will yield higher quality VAPA programs to students.
- Coordinate with school sites, community, and families to ensure equitable access to VAPA programs for all students.
- Oversee VAPA plans and budgets, VAPA events, and coordination with schools to provide internships and other work based learning opportunities for students.
- Collaborate at all levels of the organization including district staff, site administrators, and site VAPA staff, to effect district-wide efforts, purchases, and events.
- Develop a communication plan to garner and sustain external community support for VAPA collaborate with district PIO regarding the development of VAPA website, social media accounts, and other publications.
- Represents the district in a positive way within the community and accepts speaking engagements aimed at good public relations.
- Promote a culture of equity and inclusion that ensures that all VAPA programs are centered around the acceptance and achievement of all students.
- Perform other duties as assigned

- Procedures, methods and techniques of organization and management of programs
- Leadership strategies that will result in transformational change that prioritizes equitable outcomes for all students.

- Strong interpersonal communication skills.
- Establish accountability measures that ensure that every staff member is focused on equal educational opportunities for all students and families, particularly those socio-economically disadvantaged, and our culturally, ethnically, racially and linguistically diverse students and families.

- Excellent written and verbal communication skills, and ability to present to diverse audiences.
