Tile Laying— What is it?

Tile Layers, also called Tile Setters, install glass, ceramic or stone tile that you see in showers, tubs, kitchen countertops, floors, stairs, building exteriors and many other areas. Many times, they install a thick mortar base of sand, cement and lime to create a flat or curved surface for the tile installation. They may work in a new housing, in occupied homes, or on large commercial projects, malls, schools or hospitals. Work is both indoors and outdoors and at times may involve working off of scaffolding.

Qualifications

- 18 years old at time of application
- Must take the NCTI JATC entrance exam for evaluation. Passing score not necessary to the enter program
- Physically able to perform the work
- Willing and able to attend classroom training & abide by the Rules & Regulations of the NCTI JATC

Tile Layer apprenticeship consist of 5000 hours On-the-Job Training for 5 periods. After each period you will receive a wage increase, provided you also have completed the required (school) RSI credits.
