Spring Branch Academic Institute (SBAI) provides highly, exceptionally, and profoundly gifted children with advanced and appropriately challenging educational opportunities matched to their abilities, strengths, and interests. Learning experiences at SBAI challenge students to achieve high levels of academic excellence. At SBAI, we strive to shape students into active, curious, engaged and self-motivated learners.

About SBAI

SBAI is a school-within-a-school, where kindergarten through fifth-grade students are hosted at Thornwood Elementary, sixth through eighth-grade students take electives at Spring Forest Middle, and ninth through 12th-grade students are a part of Stratford High School. SBAI students are taught primarily by SBAI teachers and have the opportunity to engage in numerous activities in fine arts, athletics, Career and Technical Education (CTE), and other courses and clubs available at their respective host campuses. SBAI teachers are trained to work with gifted children and are encouraged to be masters of their craft. They leverage the Professional Learning Community process to equip students with the knowledge and skills needed to succeed.

Application Process

Students must be identified as "highly gifted" through SBISD's identification process and zoned to an SBISD school. Depending upon the IQ test administered, students need a standard score or combination of scores of 145+. Currently, application and admission are limited to elementary students only.
