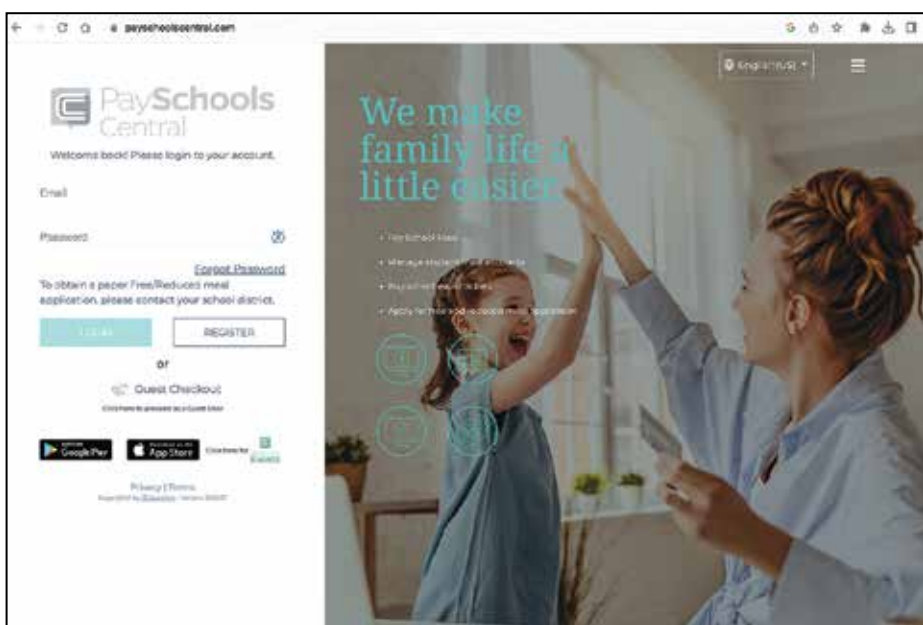

School Start Date and Time

School will begin on Wednesday, August 23 for Minerva High School and Drage seniors. Classes start at 7:30 AM sharp here at MHS.

Drage juniors start on Tuesday, August 22 - buses will be traveling from MHS to Drage, but the full routes to homes will not be available until the 23. The bus to Drage leaves at 7:15 AM each morning from the back of the building. Please drop off your student out front. It is much easier for traffic. Students can walk through the building to the buses.

School Fees

\$15.00 plus course/activity fees (they are listed in the freshman folder information as well as in the course catalog). School fees are not assessed until the end of September due to course schedule changes.

Schedules

Schedules will be available starting August 21 through HAC. Paper copies will be available on the first day of school.

Open House

There will be an Open House on **Monday, August 21 from 3 to 6 PM** at MHS. This is a great opportunity for you to meet your child's teachers, buy parking passes, complete final forms (we will have chromebooks available for families to use), receive their chromebooks and chargers, and get a copy of their upcoming class schedules.

Freshman Orientation

There will be Freshman Orientation **Friday, August 18 from 8 to 11:30 AM**. The students will have an opportunity to try their lockers, follow their schedule, and learn the expectations for arrival, lunch and the end of the school day.

School Supplies

There are no set school supply lists for high school students. Teachers in each individual class will share requirements for each of their classes when school starts. A good start for a high school student will be a folder for each of their classes, paper, pens, and some type of organization binder.

Safety

Backpacks are not allowed in the classroom. Please use a string bag or something similar that can fit under a seat. Hats are not allowed in the hallways or classrooms, we must be able to see all faces.

Parking Passes

Every student who parks at MHS must have a parking pass, this includes Drage students that park here to ride the bus. These are \$30 for the school year. We must have the make, model, license plate number, and proof of insurance. Parking passes will be available at the Open House. They will also be on sale from 9 AM to 1:00 PM on the following dates:

Technology

MHS is a 1:1 school, which means that all students have their own Chromebooks. Chromebooks are used for a variety of purposes, including taking notes, doing research, and completing assignments. Each student will be assigned a Chromebook and charger. These are the property of Minerva School District. The student is responsible for their assigned computer.

Important Student Handbook Addition 2023/24

SOCIAL PROBATION

Social Probation means that a student may not attend as a spectator any school sponsored or related function or activity. This includes, but is not limited to, clubs, athletics, competitions, dances, and trips. A student may be placed on Social Probation as a result of academic/disciplinary actions.

If a student is placed on Social Probation, he/she shall:

1. Not be allowed in the school or on school grounds outside of school hours (7:00 am to 2:45 pm) except as a participant in a school activity (i.e. school musical, after school tutoring, etc.) or sport under the direct supervision of a staff member; and
2. Not be allowed to attend, as a spectator, any school sponsored event after school hours or on weekends. Students will be asked to leave and face school discipline if they fail to comply. (i.e., athletic contests, school concerts, homecoming dances, proms, etc.)

A student will be placed on Social Probation for the following academic/attendance/disciplinary actions.

1. 28 Hours (or equivalent of 4 school days) or more absences from school at the end of each midterm of the grading period/quarter. Tardies will accumulate towards these absences for school related activities e.g., college visits, field trips, and/or athletic participation, will not count against the student for Social Probation. Absences for which students have a doctor's excuse also will not count.
2. Suspended from school 4 or more days during a midterm grading period/quarter.

If a student is placed on Social Probation because of attendance, it will start at the beginning of the next midterm or quarter and last until the midterm quarter ends (9 weeks). If a student is placed on Social Probation for disciplinary reasons (4 or more days of suspension during a grading period/quarter), Social Probation will start when he/she comes back to school from suspension and will last for 4 and a half weeks from that date. Social Probation may carry over to the following school year.

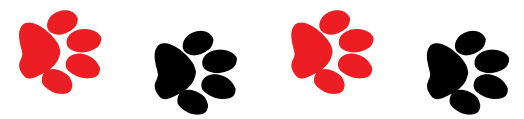

Student Schedules

Students will be able to access their schedules using their Home Access Center (HAC) accounts beginning Friday, August 18 at 3:00 PM. HAC is located on the Minerva Local Web Page under Parents and HAC Home Access Grade Center. A hard copy schedule will also be provided in homerooms on the first day of school.

Back to School Bash

Students and parents have the option to attend the MMS Back to School Bash for all incoming sixth, seventh, and eighth-graders on Monday, August 21, anytime from 5:00-7:00 PM. Students will be able to tour the building, practice opening their lockers, and review their schedule. Families will also be able to receive information on Free and Reduced Lunches, FinalForms, and other important information for the upcoming school year. Students have the option to pick up their schedules and planners in their homerooms during this event or receive student schedules on the first day of school.

First Day of School

Sixth Grade - Wednesday, August 23

We are excited to announce that Sixth-Grade Orientation will be held on the first day of school for our sixth-graders. We believe that starting the school year with a full day of instruction with only sixth-grade students on the first day of school will help ensure they get off to a strong start. This will allow them to meet their new teachers and become familiar with procedures at MMS without other students in the building.

Seventh and Eighth-Grade Thursday, August 24

This year, seventh and eighth-graders will start a day after our sixth-graders. They will start their new school year on Thursday, August 24.

School Handbook and Policies

The school handbook is posted on the Minerva Middle School website as well as student planners. The handbook includes important information regarding the MMS Mission Statement and values, dress code, cell phone policy, and absences. Please be sure to read through the handbook and sign the planner indicating you are familiar with the policies. Parents and students will also sign off electronically on FinalForms.

Call off Procedure

If a student is absent from school, it is necessary to report them off by calling the office at 330-868-4497, ext 2 by 8:30 AM. A note also needs to be sent in upon their return.

HB410 Attendance

Call the office and report the absence. Upon your child's return send a note or medical excuse.

35 or more consecutive hours in one month
65 or more consecutive hours in one year

Habitual Truant

30 or more consecutive hours
42 or more hours in one month
72 or more hours in one year

Medication

If a student is going to have any medication at school they will need to have the proper paperwork filled out and in the office. If it is over the counter, (Tylenol, ibuprofen, etc.), they may keep these in their lockers as long as they are in the bottles they came in and proper paperwork is on file. If it is a medication prescribed by a doctor, these must be kept in the office & paperwork filled out by both the parent and the doctor's office. No medications (over-the-counter or prescription) can be taken at school without prior written consent. Any questions call the school nurse, Amy Cameron, at 330-868-4497.

School Fees

School fees are \$30. Any checks written to Minerva Middle School for fees, lunches, etc. should be written separately as they have to be deposited into separate individual accounts. Students who qualify for free lunches may apply for a fee waiver.

School Lunches

School lunches cost \$2.50. You may add money to your student's account at mlsd.sparcc.org under payforit.net. Students may charge up to \$10. If charges exceed the limit, the student will be given a cheese sandwich, fruit and milk. Forms are available in the main office to fill out to qualify for free or reduced lunches.
