PRINCIPAL'S REPORT:

1. We are hosting a summer program sponsored by the United Way of Youngstown and the Mahoning Valley called Success by Six to help incoming kindergartners prepare for Kindergarten. This three week program will run from June 12th -June 30th (excluding June 19th) Monday through Friday from 8:00am-12:00pm. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT:

1. On April 25, 2023, Governor DeWine announced the names of the schools who will receive funding in the fifth round of Ohio's K-12 School Safety Grant Program. Lowellville will receive \$100,000 (\$50,000 for elementary and \$50,000 for high school) that may be used to support physical safety and security upgrades in and around the school campus.
2. In order to provide additional instructional minutes for our elementary students and a daily intervention period we will be adjusting the school day next year (2023-2024) to mirror the start and end times of the high school students. Students will begin school at 7:45 a.m. and end at 2:45 p.m. Mrs. Parry and Mr. Sammartino will be providing additional information soon.
3. Due to the change in instructional minutes for elementary students next year we will be adjusting the bus routes. In order to create and finalize the transportation routes for the 2023-2024 school year parents/guardians will be asked to complete a transportation request in the coming weeks. We ask that if your child(ren) needs transportation next year that you complete the form in a timely manner so that the routes and seat assignments can be established. All students will have an assigned seat. Elementary students will be seated in the front of the bus and older students will be seated in the back of the bus. Siblings may be seated together upon request.

NEW BUSINESS:

2. School Behavioral Health & Wellness Coordinator- The Ohio Department of Mental Health and Addiction Services and the Mahoning County Mental Health and Recovery Board have approached the district regarding a grant funded opportunity. The grant will provide the district with \$300,000 over the period of 5 years (FY23-27). The funds will be used to hire a School Behavioral Health and Wellness Coordinator (exempt position).

The Ohio Schools Wellness Initiative recommends that schools/districts identify building level staff who can assist in improving access and availability of evidence-based behavioral health promotion, prevention, and early intervention practices with school-based and community wide strategies that meet the needs of children, youth and families with the school community; and who can coordinate efforts to plan for, implement and sustain a Student Assistance Program (including Tier II/III supports) and staff wellness framework.

The School Behavioral Health & Wellness Coordinator role is multifaceted, calling for a broad range of skills and experience. It entails leading, managing, coordinating, and serving as a liaison with the members of the community. Expertise in multiple service systems— behavioral health, child welfare, early childhood, or juvenile justice—is equally important. It is also critical that the coordinator is integrated both into the school system and the larger community. Partnerships are the crux of a successful initiative, and a well connected coordinator can help to make, nurture, and sustain the many collaborations that are needed to support student assistance programs and staff wellness frameworks.

The School Behavioral Health & Wellness Coordinator will be responsible for providing leadership and direction to the overall school behavioral health and wellness efforts. This includes the development of a comprehensive plan to promote effective integration of the activities and efforts of the multiple service systems. From the outset, the School Behavioral Health & Wellness Coordinator should coordinate planning, implementing, evaluating, sustaining, and innovating their SAP practices and health education curriculum and instruction support. The School Behavioral Health & Wellness Coordinator should develop and implement a clear evaluation plan from the outset (e.g., using the Self-Assessment can facilitate this), evaluate process variables (e.g., implementation) and outcome variables (e.g., behavioral health and substance use), obtain feedback and data from diverse stakeholders, use multiple methods of data collection, and use evaluation data to inform decision-making.

WHEREAS, the Board of Education of the Lowellville Local School District (“Board”) is in need of a Treasurer/CFO for Fiscal Year 2024 (July 1, 2023 - June 30, 2024); and

The Lowellville Local School District is providing and administering a responsibility plan for students and parents as part of our Chromebook 1:1 initiative. Families will pick from two options for students in grades 3-12 who take their Chromebook home.

Option 1 - Annual Warranty	
Cost:	An annual non refundable \$50 warranty.
Type of Coverage	Regardless of potential/accidental damage to a student's Chromebook, the \$50 warranty will cover the student's responsibility.
Family Cap	\$150
Effective Date	Based on receipt of signed agreement and payment of the annual warranty of \$50.
Expiration Date	Last day of school for the 2023-2024 school year or date of un-enrollment.

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Option 2 - Tiered Payment Structure	
Cost:	Tier 1 - \$25, Tier 2 - \$50, Tier 3 - \$100, Tier 4 - \$200
Type of Coverage	Coverage is based on a Tiered System and type of damage.
	Tier 1 \$25 - Missing keys on keyboard, peeled up trackpad, minor chassis/casing damage, broken camera, broken or lost/stolen power adapter, broken speaker, and additional damages as applicable.
	Tier 2 \$50 - Moderate chassis/casing damage, additional damages as applicable, combined Tier 1 damage.
	Tier 3 \$100 - Damaged screen, major chassis/casing damage impacting 3 or more parts of the device, damaged mainboard power button or ports, additional damages as applicable, and combined Tier 1-2 damage.
	Tier 4 \$200 - Device replacement due to fluid damage, destruction, loss, or theft, additional damages as applicable, combined Tier 1-2-3 damage.

Student is responsible if:

Student Loaner Devices

- If a student device is damaged, he or she WILL receive a loaner during the repair process. Students should treat the loaner as if it were the original device. If the loaner is damaged, students are financially responsible for all repair costs.
- If a device has been misplaced or left at home, students WILL NOT receive a loaner. Payment for the lost device will be required within a week to receive a new device. If the device is found, a refund of payment will be given to the student.
