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We are so excited that each of you will be joining or returning as Conejos! This year will be full of changes with regard to our school schedule, calendar, and free meals - but what hasn't changed is that we are dedicated to ensuring each student is learning to be the best student they can be. One change that has impacted Chamiza this year more than years before is our enrollment. As our community has begun to age, our enrollment has declined in number. This requires us to adjust our traditional planning of class lists. This year we have combo classes at each grade level. 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Student Placement Policy

Students are placed to equitably balance classrooms. Accordingly, teachers and administration consider gender, ELD status, academic needs, peer compatibility, Special Education supports and parent/guardian feedback via the Teaching Style Request Survey, which is sent out at the end of each school year.

Once we have made the final placement decisions, we do not move children except in very particular instances. It is our firm belief that all children will learn in our classrooms. No requests shall be considered during the first 20 days of school.

If a parent request to move a student occurs the following process will be followed:

Teachers and Parents meet to discuss concerns, schedule a parent classroom observation, and then a follow-up meeting to discuss observation.. Hopefully, any concerns can be addressed and solved during these meetings.

If the concern has not been resolved the adult requesting the change will need to email the principal to request a meeting explaining the concern, the dates of the original and follow-up meeting as well as the observation date, and the outcome of the meeting(s). During the Principal-Parent-Teacher meeting concerns, observations & meeting notes will be reviewed and discussed. Unless there is a verified safety concern, a plan will be created to address the concerns that support the students in remaining in the original classroom. The timeline of this plan will be determined at the meeting but shall be no less than two weeks. The principal will follow up with the involved parties nearing the end of the timeline to determine

the effectiveness of the plan. Should an additional meeting be needed one will be met.

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Chamiza's 2023-2024 Arrival and Dismissal Guidance



To ensure your family's arrival and dismissal at Chamiza is as quick and safe as possible we have four options for student arrival and departure from school. Please review the boxes below to determine the style(s) that work best for your family. All families are asked to put your phones away and stay alert when you enter the parking lot. A distracted driver is dangerous. Please use this time to help ensure your students have their backpacks and personal items ready when exiting the car. This will help expedite the process for when teachers begin their duty time at 7:50 am for arrival, and 3:05 pm for dismissal.

Breakfast will be provided for students upon arrival, to eat in the classroom

If you need to pick up your student prior to the end of the day, please ensure you arrive to the school no later than 2:35 pm. Students will not be be checked out the last 30 minutes of the school day as this poses a disruption to the classroom, as teachers are finishing with end of day instructions.

Walk-Up Drop-Off/Pick-Ups Families who wish to drop off or pick up their students up, by walking to the front of the school may do so. If driving to the school, we ask you to park in the main parking lot <u>only</u> and cross over with your student. Please wait for guidance from the staff member on duty to cross at the cross walk to ensure the safety of drivers and pedestrians. We will support pedestrian crossing between the main entry and the parking lot every 2-5 minutes or until all cars have passed through, whichever is sooner.

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Walking Families Students who live in the neighborhood north/north-east of the school will be able to enter the school grounds using the gate to the field, that enters into the neighborhood. This gate will be open prior to school beginning, as well at the end of the day. Students who need to arrive before 8:05 am or leave after 3:15 pm will need to enroll in one of the before or after-school programs. The accessibility of the field/neighborhood gate is available if the gate remains functioning to ensure the safety of Chamiza students/staff.

If you are picking your student up at the front of the school to walk home, please stay on the sidewalk when leaving the school grounds and model safety by only crossing streets at a pre-identified crosswalk and/or with the crossing guards. Parent Drop Off/Pick Up To minimize our lines before and after school we will be allowing our Kindergarten & SCS students (and their siblings) to be dropped off/picked up at the west parking lot. A placard will be given to you to display in your front window. If you need more than one please let your student's teacher know. All other students will be able to be dropped off and picked up at the east parking lot drive through loop, which is directly in front of the main entrance. When dropping off or picking up students at parent drop off/pick up, please help keep students safe by:

- Not letting your student enter or exit the car, until fully stopped.
- Please do not put your car in reverse when in the drop off/pick up lane to enter the drive thru lane. When the car in front of you moves forward is when you will be able to move forward and change lanes.
- Please do not exit your car. If you need to get out to support them exiting or wish them well, please park in the parking lot and refer to the Walk-Up Drop-Off/Pick-Up Guidance
