

The Millville Area School Board held their regular meeting on Monday, January 9, 2023, in the Millville Jr./Sr. High School Library beginning 7:00 pm, followed by board member candidate interviews.

### ROLL CALL

The following Board members answered roll call: William Berger, Brynn Clark, Susan Farr, Greg Hemsarh, Heather Mausteller, Susan Myers, and Jessica Whitmoyer.

Also present were Joseph Rasmus, Whitney Holloway, Edward Sanders, Noah Adams, Bonnie Gregory, Matthew McWilliams and Chelsea Rosenberger.

### GUEST RECOGNITION AND COMMENTS

Michael Weaver, Alex Cavallini, Gena Maize, Matthew Diehl, and Becky Jacobs signed the register, but did not have any comments at this time.

### SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

#### *MASD Electronic Device Procedure*

- Mr. Rasmus began his report by sharing an update on the Electronic Device Procedure. He stated that the new procedure has been put in place since the return from the holiday break for the safety of students.

#### *Act 80 Day January 3, 2023*

- Mr. Rasmus reviewed the professional development undertaken by the district at the Act 80 day on January 3, 2023. He shared that teachers worked on Curriculum development and iReady training. Mr. Rasmus explained that teachers are preparing to give the second round of diagnostic assessments and were training in iReady to review the data.
- In recognition of Mrs. Davis and the Special Education department, Mr. Rasmus shared that the special education audit was completed and the teachers were reviewing the findings from the audit during the Act 80 day. He was congratulatory because the audit returned very few findings to rectify for the district.

#### *State Assessments 2022-2023*

- Mr. Rasmus explained to the board that the district was going to be introducing online assessments for state testing. The high school had already begun this with the Keystone Exams, and the process was viewed positively. In his report for the board of education, Mr. Rasmus included a chart of the growing trends across the commonwealth, sharing that online assessments have been encouraged and will become more and more commonplace. In addition, the ease of assessments and digital accommodations are a huge positive factor for taking assessments online.
- In response to this discussion, Mrs. Brynn Clark shared that her daughter and student of the district had recently shared her concern about her lack of typing skills and the impact that would have on taking state assessments online. To this, Mr. Rasmus mentioned that this same feedback had been shared by other stakeholders. In response to the feedback, he encouraged the students to practice typing in their regular education classes as much as possible so that the students become more comfortable.

#### *Columbia Montour Area Vocational Technical School*

- In conclusion to his report, Mr. Rasmus shared as the Superintendent of Record for CMAVTS about some recent changes happening at the school. The Joint Operating Committee recently appointed Dr. Alan Lonoconus as Interim Administrative Director and Ms. Jess Harry/Ms. Pamela Kramer as Interim Co-Special Education Directors. In addition, he shared about some recent changes to the school calendar to allow for extra professional development.

### BUSINESS MANAGER'S REPORT

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- Mrs. Holloway had previously submitted her report for the board's consideration but added that she has been busy with the end of the month reporting. She presented the numbers for tax collection, which she believed to be mostly completed at this point.
- In addition to her report, Mrs. Holloway mentioned that tax collection is up about 4% overall, mentioning that this could also be due to the increase in taxes for the year. She went on to highlight that delinquent taxes have significantly decreased, the collection rate had increased, and the breakdown of interest had significantly increased.
  - Mrs. Heather Mausteller then asked of Mrs. Holloway if the tax certification fee was the same as what the district receives for duplicate tax bills. Mrs. Holloway answered that this was the same figure and that she still receives those requests from time to time.

**SCHOOL BOARD INTERVIEWS**

At this point in the meeting (7:40 pm), President Susan Myers transitioned the meeting to interviews for the open position of Millville Area School District school board member. The candidate interview questions and answers are as follows.

Alex Cavallini

1. We have all read your application/resume. Please tell us why you applied for the position and/or what your objective for being on the Board is. What makes you the best candidate for the position?
  - a. I saw the open position and saw it as a way to get involved. My background in is IT, so I thought I would have a unique perspective. I do not have an agenda for entering the board.
2. What qualities do you think are important for a board member to possess?
  - a. I would say dependability and reliability. I believe that as a board member, you need to be in attendance to make your vote count. In my career, I have worked for Geisinger for 20 years and they have found me reliable.
3. Attendance is an important part of the role. The Board meets the 2<sup>nd</sup> & 4<sup>th</sup> Mondays of most months, as well as having occasional Committee and/or special meetings. Do you have any obligations that would preclude you from attending the majority of the regular meetings?
  - a. Absolutely not, I would not have an issue. I am super boring and work from home, nothing that would keep me from being here on those days.
4. Confidentiality is also an important part of the position. Certain topics, including personnel, legal and negotiations, are handled in Executive Session and are not to be discussed outside the Board meeting. Do you have any prior experience that required you to maintain confidentiality of information? (Work, other boards, etc.)
  - a. In my day-to-day work experience, I have HIPAA rules that I must follow. I have also worked on the team for health records about people at one point. Therefore, I am familiar with how to keep things under my hat.
5. What areas concern you most about the District, both now and in the future? What do you feel should be the primary focus in the District?
  - a. As an outsider looking into the district, I am concerned about retention of faculty members. I have seen some great teachers here and would like to see them stay.
6. Do you have any questions for the Board?
  - a. I have no additional questions at this time.

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1. We have all read your application/resume. Please tell us why you applied for the position and/or what your objective for being on the Board is. What makes you the best candidate for the position?
  - a. The biggest reason I applied is that I have been a lifelong resident of Millville with a daughter currently in the district. I would like to become part of the decision-making process. Ideally, I would like to do more than just hear and see concerns, but also have a say in those concerns.
2. What qualities do you think are important for a board member to possess?
  - a. I would say having a general understanding of business is helpful. I think a board member should be able to look at current decisions on the table and be able to formulate decisions with the utmost care and concern for the district.
3. Attendance is an important part of the role. The Board meets the 2<sup>nd</sup> & 4<sup>th</sup> Mondays of most months, as well as having occasional Committee and/or special meetings. Do you have any obligations that would preclude you from attending the majority of the regular meetings?
  - a. No, I do not have anything that would keep me from attending.
4. Confidentiality is also an important part of the position. Certain topics, including personnel, legal and negotiations, are handled in Executive Session and are not to be discussed outside the Board meeting. Do you have any prior experience that required you to maintain confidentiality of information? (Work, other boards, etc.)
  - a. I do have experience, but not within a school district. I am a member of other local committees (Nursery Association). When decisions are made on those committees, I cannot take that information and share it. In other jobs, I have not been able to share or disclose personnel information in my role.
5. What areas concern you most about the District, both now and in the future? What do you feel should be the primary focus in the District?
  - a. I am concerned about the future and longevity of the district. I am not sure how long the district can survive, having hear statements from community members about Millville being pulled apart. I am concerned about how that would look and do not want to see that happen.
6. Do you have any questions for the Board?
  - a. I have no further questions.

Becky Jacobs

1. We have all read your application/resume. Please tell us why you applied for the position and/or what your objective for being on the Board is. What makes you the best candidate for the position?
  - a. I have worked within the district and have children in the school. I believe I can give insight into how employees feel in certain situations as well as how I feel as a parent. I can share how my students feel.
2. What qualities do you think are important for a board member to possess?
  - a. I think a school board member should have an open mind and be able to hear each view before making a decision. They should take the time and be willing to listen. In addition, school board members should be at each meeting, read everything, and listen thoroughly.
3. Attendance is an important part of the role. The Board meets the 2<sup>nd</sup> & 4<sup>th</sup> Mondays of most months, as well as having occasional Committee and/or special meetings. Do you have any obligations that would preclude you from attending the majority of the regular meetings?
  - a. I do have an issue with attendance for the most part, but I do have four children at home. There should not be much interference, so I would be able to make it most of the time.
4. Confidentiality is also an important part of the position. Certain topics, including personnel, legal and negotiations, are handled in Executive Session and are not to be discussed outside the Board meeting. Do you have any prior experience that required you to maintain confidentiality of information? (Work, other boards, etc.)
  - a. I was the manager and assistant manager at different jobs and there were confidentiality aspects in all of those jobs with personnel information.
5. What areas concern you most about the District, both now and in the future? What do you feel should be the primary focus in the District?

- a. My overall concern is safety. I believe that the district is doing a good job with safety. Also, I am concerned about education and the amount of time students spend online and the testing moving to online. I am concerned about students who suffer migraines and headaches due to the amount of time online.
6. Do you have any questions for the Board?
  - a. I have no additional questions at this time.

#### Gena Maize

1. We have all read your application/resume. Please tell us why you applied for the position and/or what your objective for being on the Board is. What makes you the best candidate for the position?
  - a. I applied for the position because I like to be active in the community. I believe that we need to share our talents, skills and life experiences. I would like to bring a benefit to this community, create an environment where everyone can feel comfortable, be able to speak freely, and bring any benefits to the table. I handle financial information for Geisinger, and I can bring it to the table. I believe in a good quality of education, and I was a student of Millville Area School District, loving my time. I want to ensure that remains for others. I was encouraged by the amount of people interviewing today for the open position.
2. What qualities do you think are important for a board member to possess?
  - a. I believe a school board member should possess good listening skills, not be overly reactive, and hear situations to help organize them into an opinion.
3. Attendance is an important part of the role. The Board meets the 2<sup>nd</sup> & 4<sup>th</sup> Mondays of most months, as well as having occasional Committee and/or special meetings. Do you have any obligations that would preclude you from attending the majority of the regular meetings?
  - a. No, I do not have any issues with attendance. My typical work night ends at 6 pm, but I can accommodate whatever times.
4. Confidentiality is also an important part of the position. Certain topics, including personnel, legal and negotiations, are handled in Executive Session and are not to be discussed outside the Board meeting. Do you have any prior experience that required you to maintain confidentiality of information? (Work, other boards, etc.)
  - a. That is my experience every day in my work for Geisinger. I have to be able to make decisions do not have an issue with confidentiality regularly.
5. What areas concern you most about the District, both now and in the future? What do you feel should be the primary focus in the District?
  - a. I am not sure how to answer because there is such a span of concerns that present in a school district. I have not been keeping up with current issues and are concerned with issues coming from the community.
6. Do you have any questions for the Board?
  - a. What are the biggest problems you all see? I am encouraged by the financial reports I heard this evening.
  - b. Mr. Berger: We are a small district, so it can be hard to balance the financials.
  - c. Mrs. Myers: We have an issue with retention of staff, with a lot of ins and outs.
  - d. Mr. Rasmus: We have a hard time getting staff in this climate and have had to use nontraditional ways to staff the schools.

#### Michael Weaver

1. We have all read your application/resume. Please tell us why you applied for the position and/or what your objective for being on the Board is. What makes you the best candidate for the position?
  - a. I was raised in Millville and had 3 children who attended the school. I wanted to wait to serve on a school board until my children were out of school. I believe my business background gives me a



different point of view on the aspects the school board is looking for. I am also interested in the integration of the community and the school together.

2. What qualities do you think are important for a board member to possess?
  - a. I believe a school board member should have integrity, strong communication skills, get your points across but still be heard, not have an agenda, and not enter with an ego.
3. Attendance is an important part of the role. The Board meets the 2<sup>nd</sup> & 4<sup>th</sup> Mondays of most months, as well as having occasional Committee and/or special meetings. Do you have any obligations that would preclude you from attending the majority of the regular meetings?
  - a. I am self-employed and waited until my schedule would allow. I have whatever time is needed for service, doing research and making sure I am caught up on all the concerns.
4. Confidentiality is also an important part of the position. Certain topics, including personnel, legal and negotiations, are handled in Executive Session and are not to be discussed outside the Board meeting. Do you have any prior experience that required you to maintain confidentiality of information? (Work, other boards, etc.)
  - a. In my work experience, I have DOD security clearance. I have also had 12 startup businesses that have helped me over the years from infancy.
5. What areas concern you most about the District, both now and in the future? What do you feel should be the primary focus in the District?
  - a. My primary concern would be the image of the school district in the community. To get people to stay in the community, I believe the school district has to have a strong brand. When thinking of local schools in our area, what image is Millville Area School District put out there?
6. Do you have any questions for the Board?
  - a. I have no additional questions at this time, but if I am the chosen candidate, I would be interested in the CSIU position.

At the conclusion, Board President Mrs. Susan Myers asked all of the candidates to return to the library for their deliberation at 8:20 pm. Mrs. Myers clarified for the candidates that the chosen candidate for would be finishing out this year and can file a petition with the County to remain on the board through election in November 2023 or do a write-in campaign. Mrs. Mausteller added that those not chosen should still remain involved in the district. Mrs. Myers then added that even if not chosen, interested individuals can still run in the election. In addition, Mr. Hemsarth added that he does often get questions about how to run and asked that this information be added to the Board of Education page on the school's website. Mr. Rasmus answered that we could in fact do that.

#### DELIBERATION
