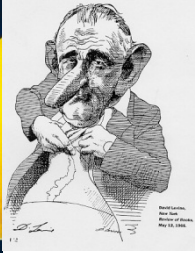
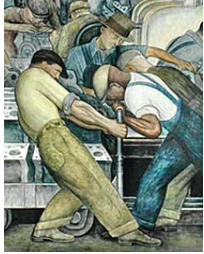


AP US HISTORY
