#### **COVID GUIDELINES:**

Q: What are the latest guidelines for students with a COVID-19 positive household member?

A: Get tested immediately if the student shows symptoms. Isolate immediately if you have a positive test. Retest on Day 6 if no symptoms and wear a mask. Follow these guidelines: <u>https://</u> www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/your-health/ifyou-were-exposed.html

Contact the school nurse for a masking plan for the student.

#### Q: What symptoms should I look for?

**A:** People with COVID-19 have had a wide range of symptoms reported – ranging from mild symptoms to severe illness including:

Muscle or body aches, Fatigue, Headache, Sore throat, Fever or chills, Congestion or runny nose, Cough, Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, New loss of taste or smell, Nausea or vomiting, Diarrhea

Q: How long is isolation for a person who tests positive for COVID?

A: Contact the school nurse to share the date of onset of symptoms and the positive test date. Day Zero is calculated with this information. Isolate for 5 full days. Wear a mask through day 10. The CDC now has an online calculator to establish an isolation and masking plan.See the link for instructions: <u>https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/</u> your-health/isolation.html
